




The Teens

- 3,600 Vehicles \$72,000 Total Budget
- 36,000 Miles of Public Roads



1951 - Highway Audit Commission Report

- "the advice counsel and expert know-how which is available from the Department's own technical
- 750,000il/ehitles staffs bear scant weight indeed
- when they are in conflict with the political 11,000 Miles State Highways of the moment." (8,800 Paved)
- 9 Legislative Acts Restructured Commission since 1913
- 1952 Mack Blackwell Amendment



The Seventies



- Legislature transferred nearly 1,000 more miles of County Roads to Highway System
- South Terminal Interchange

- 1st State to Complete its Interstate System (1975)
- 1.7 million Vehicles; 16,000 Highway Miles (15,000 Paved)

Toad Suck Ferry on Arkansas River at Highway 60, 1970




The Eighties
