


History of the Department

The Sixties and Seventies

- **No changes to Commission Structure**
 - Department became Debt Free

South®Ter<u>Legislature transferred nearly 4,400 more miles of County</u>ell burning Roads to Highway System bonds at a ceremony in 1975.

- Department adds "Transportation" to its name Authority Expanded
- 1st State to Complete its Interstate System (1975)
- 16,000 Highway Miles (15,000 Paved)

- 1991 Highway Improvement Program

1991 High 1999 Cast State Gast Tax Increase improve or replace approximately 560 bridges.

- 1999 Interstate Rehabilitation Program First Highway Bond Issue in 50 years
- I-540 (now I-49) and I-530 Completed
- 16,400 Highway Miles Hopper Tunnel, 1999
