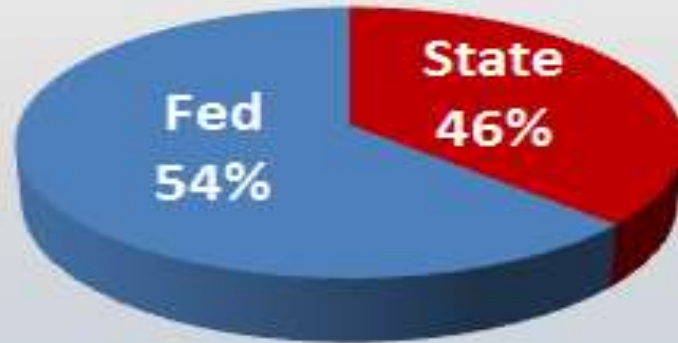

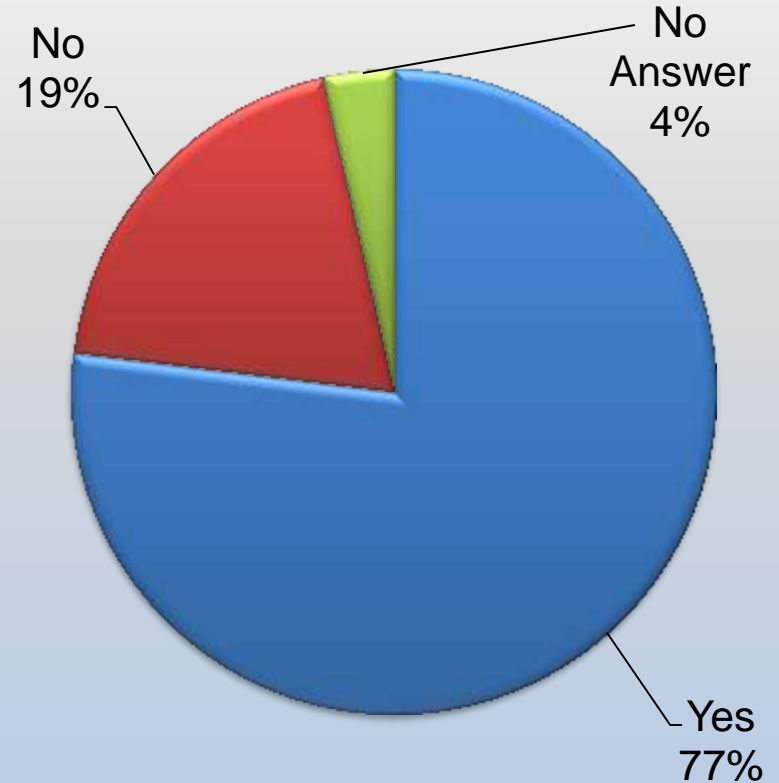

Are you satisfied with the condition of the existing highway system?

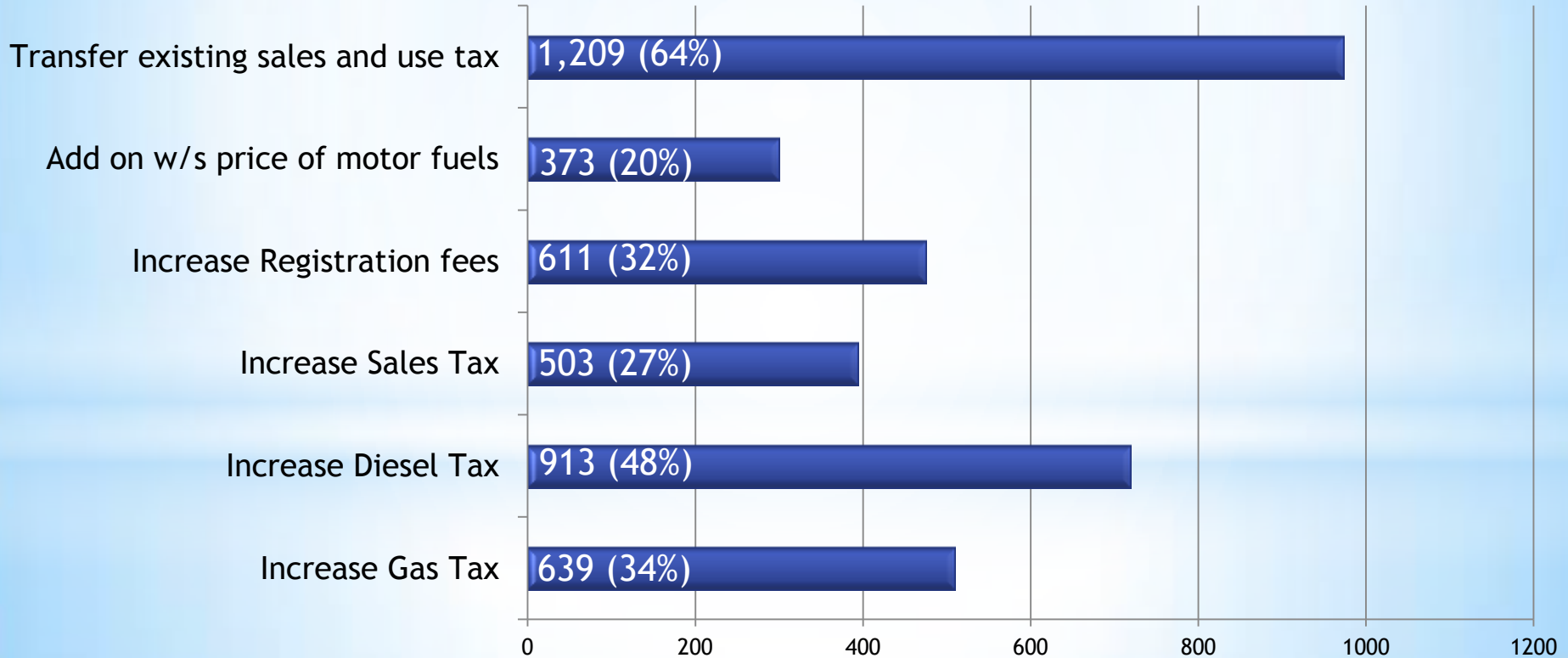


Would you support a new highway program that would generate additional revenue?

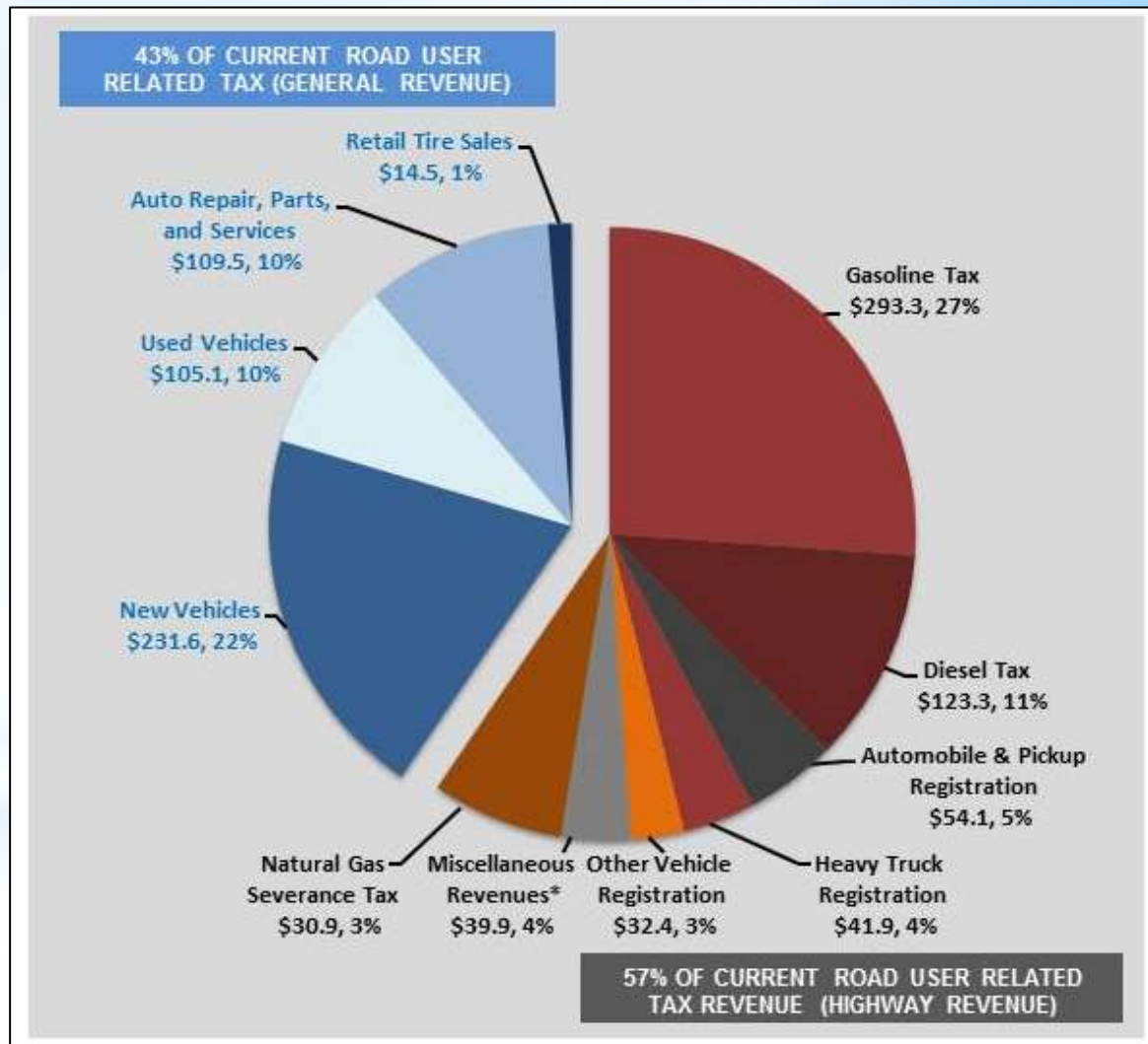
