
- Current STIP Schedule

 - ✓ Summer 2018 - Receive MPOs Transportation Improvement Programs (TIPs)
 - ✓ August 2018 - Submit to Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and Federal Transit Administration (FTA)
 - ✓ September 2018 - Approval from FHWA and FTA







THE CITIES OF LITTLE ROCK AND NORTH LITTLE ROCK HAVE REQUESTED TO PARTNER WITH THE DEPARTMENT ON 30 CROSSING.

THE CITIES HAVE ASKED FOR:

- **AN OPPORTUNITY TO INCLUDE ELEMENTS CONSIDERED IMPORTANT TO EACH CITY IN THE REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS FROM DESIGN-BUILD TEAMS**
- **AGREED TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT TO DEFINE THESE ELEMENTS AND ESTABLISH THE LEVEL OF FUNDING TO BE PROVIDED BY EACH CITY**


EL DORADO HAS AGREED TO ACCEPT OWNERSHIP OF HIGHWAYS 82B AND 167B.

THE CITY OF GREENWOOD HAS EXPRESSED INTEREST IN PARTNERING WITH THE DEPARTMENT TO CONSTRUCT A BYPASS OF HIGHWAY 10.

THE DEPARTMENT WILL BEGIN AN ENVIRONMENTAL STUDY THAT WILL IDENTIFY THE PREFERRED ALTERNATIVE AND COST, WHICH WILL FACILITATE FUTURE PARTNERING DISCUSSIONS WITH THE CITY.



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
