The Environmental Division has reviewed the referenced project and it falls within the definition of the Tier 3 Categorical Exclusion as defined by the AHTD/FHWA Memorandum of Agreement on the processing of Categorical Exclusions. The following information is included for your review and, if acceptable, approval as the environmental documentation for this project.

The purpose of this project is to improve the Highways 65/35 intersection and realign two curves on Highway 35 in Chicot County. The total project length is 0.72 mile. A project location map is enclosed.

Existing Highway 65 at this intersection consists of four 12-foot wide paved travel lanes, a 12-foot wide left turn lane, with 8-foot wide outside shoulders and 6-foot wide inside shoulders. The existing right of way width is 280 feet.

Existing Highway 35 west of the intersection consists of two 12-foot wide paved travel lanes with 2'- 8' wide shoulders. Highway 35 east of the intersection consists of two

11-foot wide paved travel lanes with 0'- 8' foot wide shoulders. The existing right of way width varies between 50'- 346'.

Proposed improvements to Highway 35 include two 12'-16' wide travel lanes with 4'-8' wide shoulders. The proposed right of way averages between 98'-120'. Approximately 8.9 acres of additional right of way will be required for this project. No changes to the cross section of Highway 65 are proposed.

Design data for this project (Highway 35) is as follows:

There are no relocatees, environmental justice issues, or endangered species associated with this project. No impacts to cultural resources are anticipated; concurrence from the State Historic Preservation Officer is enclosed. Field inspections found no evidence of existing underground storage tanks or hazardous waste deposits. Approximately 6.6 acres of Prime Farmland will be converted to highway right of way and Form NRCS-CPA-106 is enclosed. No Section 404 permit will be required.

Noise predictions have been made for this project utilizing the Federal Highway Administration's TNM 2.5 (Traffic Noise Model) procedures. These procedures indicate that noise levels are below the FHWA noise criteria beyond the project's proposed right of way limits and no sensitive receptors are currently impacted. Any increases in roadway noise levels will not be the result of the proposed project, but instead a result of traffic volume increases during the planning period (Year 2037). Therefore, any noise level increases will occur independently of this proposed project, and no project related noise impacts are anticipated. In compliance with Federal guidelines, local authorities will not require notification.

Chicot County participates in the National Flood Insurance Program. All of the floodplain encroachments within this highway construction project will be designed to comply with the county's local flood damage prevention ordinance. The project lies within Zone AE, Special Flood Hazard Area. The final project design will be reviewed to confirm that the design is adequate and that the potential risk to life and property are minimized. Adjacent properties should not be impacted nor have a greater flood risk than existed before construction of the project. None of the encroachments will constitute a significant floodplain encroachment or a significant risk to property or life.



An open forum Public Involvement meeting for the proposed project was held at the Dermott School District Administration Building (Professional Development Room) from 4:00-7:00 p.m. on Thursday, January 31, 2017. Special efforts to involve minorities and the public in the meetings included the following:

- Display advertisement placed in the *Chicot County Spector* on Wednesday, January 18, 2017 and Wednesday, January 25, 2017.
- Display advertisement placed in the *McGhee-Dermott Times-News*, on Wednesday, January 18, 2017 and Wednesday, January 25, 2017.
- Public Service Announcement placed in Cumulus Media-Power 92.3 FM.
- Letters mailed to Public Officials.
- Distribution of flyers in the project area.

The following information was available for inspection and comment:

- Displays including an aerial photograph at a scale of 1 inch equals 100 feet.
- Preliminary plans at a scale of 1 inch equals 50 feet.

Handouts for the public included a comment sheet and a small-scale map illustrating the project location, which was identical to the aerial photograph display. Copies of the handouts are attached.

- One individual wanted the speed reduced to 55 mph on Highway 65.
- One individual says two businesses were lost at Yellow Bend Port due to curves.
- One individual indicated it would disrupt irrigation systems and wells.
- One individual indicated that Highway 35 needs shoulders.
- One individual indicates that Alternative 2 would not be safe for children living in the houses in the curves.
- One individual indicated a historical sign is located on the north side of the road on Alternative 2.




