The Environmental Division has reviewed the referenced project and it falls within the definition of the Tier 3 Categorical Exclusion as defined by the ARDOT/FHWA Memorandum of Agreement on the processing of Categorical Exclusions. The following information is included for your review and, if acceptable, approval as the environmental documentation for this project.

The purpose of this project is to rehabilitate a portion of Highway 16 in Washington County. Work will include ultra-thin bonded wearing course on the roadway, hydro-demolition of the Illinois River bridge, and joint work. The existing cross-section will not change as a result of the proposed project and no additional right of way will be required. A project location map is enclosed.

There are no relocations, wetlands, hazardous materials, or prime farmland impacts associated with this project. No impacts to cultural resources are anticipated; concurrence from the State Historic Preservation Officer is enclosed.

The official species list obtained through the US Fish and Wildlife Services' (USFWS) Information for Planning and Consultation Website identifies nine threatened and endangered species as potentially occurring in the project area. The species are the gray bat (*Myotis grisescens*), Indiana bat (*Myotis sodalis*), northern long-eared bat (*Myotis septentrionalis*), Ozark big-eared bat (*Corynorhinus townsendii ingens*), Piping Plover (*Charadrius melodus*), Ozark cavefish (*Ambylopsis rosae*), Neosho Mucket (*Lampsilis rafinesqueana*), Rabbitsfoot (*Theliderma cylindrica*), and Missouri Bladderpod (*Physaria filiformis*). Critical habitat for the Neosho Mucket was also listed as present within the project area. The project was determined to have no effect on the Piping Plover due to a

lack of suitable habitat in the project area. Due to the limited scope of the action, minimal adjacent habitat, distance to known species locations, and the inclusion of a special provision governing hydrodemolition procedures, the determination was made that the project may affect, but was not likely to adversely affect all other listed species and the critical habitat for Neosho Mucket. The USFWS correspondence is enclosed.

Based upon the ARDOT's Policy on Highway Traffic Noise Abatement, a noise analysis is not required for this project. This project does not involve added capacity, construction of new through lanes or auxiliary lanes, changes in the horizontal or vertical alignment of the roadway or exposure of noise sensitive land uses to a new or existing highway noise source.



The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (Service) is responding to your request dated October 23, 2017, regarding Arkansas Department of Transportation Job Number 040729 Pavement preservation in Washington County, AR. The project was described and assessed as follows (abbreviated):

The project will consist of Ultra-Thin Bonded Wearing Course overlay and some bridge rehabilitation including hydrodemolition on Hwy 16 bridge over the Illinois River. In addition to the normal best management practices, Special Provisions (attached in the submittal) will be added to the contract as conservation measures to minimize potential effects to listed resources.

The following species were identified by the Information for Planning and Consultation (IPaC) website as occurring in the vicinity of this action:

There is a total of 9 threatened, endangered, or candidate species on this species list. Species on this list should be considered in an effects analysis for your project and could include species that exist in another geographic area. For example, certain fish may appear on the species list because a project could affect downstream species. See the "Critical habitats" section below for those critical habitats that lie wholly or partially within your project area under this office's jurisdiction. Due to the limited scope of the action (i.e., paving existing roadway), minimal adjacent habitat effect, distance to known species locations, the standard special provision for sediment control, and the special provision for management of hydrodemolition wastewater, the Service concurs with the determination of "may affect, not likely to adversely affect" for Gray Bat, Indiana Bat, Northern Long-eared Bat, Ozark Big-eared Bat, Ozark Cavefish, Neosho Mucket, Rabbitsfoot, and Missouri Bladderpod, including Critical Habitat for Neosho Mucket. There is no data indicating the presence of Piping Plover occurrence in the vicinity of this action; furthermore, this species does not occur in the habitat type within the affected area of this action. No further consultation regarding these species is necessary at this time.

To Whom It May Concern:

The enclosed species list identifies endangered, threatened, proposed, and candidate species, as well as proposed and final designated critical habitat, that may occur within the boundary of your proposed project and/or may be affected by your proposed project. The species list fulfills the requirements of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (Service) under section 7(c) of the Endangered Species Act (Act) of 1973, as amended (16 U.S.C. 1531 et seq.). This letter only provides an official species list and technical assistance; if you determine that listed species and/or designated critical habitat may be affected in any way by the proposed project, even if the effect is wholly beneficial, consultation with the Service will be necessary.

The purpose of the Act is to provide a means whereby threatened and endangered species and the ecosystems upon which they depend may be conserved. Under sections 7(a)(1) and 7(a)(2) of the Act and its implementing regulations (50 CFR 402 et seq.), federal agencies are required to utilize their authorities to carry out programs for the conservation of threatened and endangered species and to determine whether projects may affect threatened and endangered species and/or designated critical habitat. Proper implementation and maintenance of best management practices specified in these guidance documents is necessary to avoid adverse effects to federally protected species and often avoids the more lengthy formal consultation process.

If your species list includes any mussels, Northern Long-eared Bat, Indiana Bat, Yellowcheek Darter, Red-cockaded Woodpecker, or American Burying Beetle, your project may require a presence/absence and/or habitat survey prior to commencing project activities. We strongly recommend that you contact the appropriate staff species lead biologist (see office directory or species page) prior to conducting presence/absence surveys to ensure the appropriate level of effort and methodology.

Under the ESA, it is the responsibility of the Federal action agency or its designated representative to determine if a proposed action "may affect" endangered, threatened, or proposed species, or designated critical habitat, and if so, to consult with the Service further. Similarly, it is the responsibility of the Federal action agency or project proponent, not the Service, to make "no effect" determinations. If you determine that your proposed action will have "no effect" on threatened or endangered species or their respective critical habitat, you do not need to seek concurrence with the Service. Nevertheless, it is a violation of Federal law to harm or harass any federally-listed threatened or endangered fish or wildlife species without the appropriate permit.

Through the consultation process, we will analyze information contained in a biological assessment that you provide. If your proposed action is associated with Federal funding or permitting, consultation will occur with the Federal agency under section 7(a)(2) of the ESA. Otherwise, an incidental take permit pursuant to section 10(a)(1)(B) of the ESA (also known as a habitat conservation plan) is necessary to harm or harass federally listed threatened or endangered fish or wildlife species. In either case, there is no mechanism for authorizing incidental take "after-the-fact." New information based on updated surveys, changes in the abundance and distribution of species, changed habitat conditions, or other factors could change this list.
