Tier 2 Categorical Exclusion

The Environmental Division has reviewed the referenced project and it falls within the definition of a Tier 2 Categorical Exclusion under 23 Code of Federal Regulations, Section 771.117, and the ARDOT/FHWA Memorandum of Agreement on the processing of Categorical Exclusions. A public hearing will not be offered for this project.

The purpose of this project is to reconstruct approximately 0.8 mile of Highway 38 in West Memphis. The job extends from Highway 70 to Southland Drive in Crittenden County. A project location map is attached.

Highway 38 currently consists of four 12' wide travel lanes with a center lane that varies between a two-way left turn lane, northbound and southbound left turn lanes, and a painted or raised median. The highway has curb-and-gutter with isolated sections of sidewalk between the south frontage road and Highway 70. Between the south frontage road and Southland Dr., the highway has 8' wide paved shoulders and no sidewalks. The proposed job would not change the cross section of Highway 38 or require additional right of way. Traffic would be maintained on Highway 38 throughout construction.

There are no relocations, public water supplies, cultural resources, wetlands, streams, prime farmland, or environmental justice impacts associated with this project. There are underground storage tanks at fuel stations in the project area, including reports of known leaking underground storage tanks, but it is unlikely that any contamination has spread to the existing highway right of way. No Section 404 permit will be required for this project.

The official species list obtained through the United State Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) Information for Planning and Consultation website lists four endangered species and two threatened species as potentially occurring within the project area: the Piping Plover (Charadrius melodus), pallid sturgeon (Scaphirhynchus albus), Fat Pocketbook (Potamilus capax), Rabbitsfoot (Theliderma cylindrica), Scaleshell (Leptodea leptodon), and pondberry (Lindera melissifolia). Based on the lack of habitat and distance to known species, the project will have no effect on the listed species.

Based upon the ARDOT's Policy on Highway Traffic Noise Abatement, a noise analysis is not required for this project. This project does not involve added capacity, construction of new through lanes or auxiliary lanes, changes in the horizontal or vertical alignment of the roadway, or exposure of noise sensitive land uses to a new or existing highway noise source.

The City of West Memphis participates in the National Flood Insurance Program. The project lies within Zone AE, Special Flood Hazard Area. The final project design will be reviewed to confirm that the design is adequate and that the potential risk to life and property are minimized. Adjacent properties should not be impacted nor have a greater flood risk than existed before construction of the project. None of the encroachments will constitute a significant floodplain encroachment or a significant risk to property or life.



This job proposes to reconstruct Martin Luther King Jr. (MLK) Drive along slightly more than 0.8 miles from US 70/E. Broadway Avenue to Southland Drive, in West Memphis, Crittenden County. The Project Location is approximately 0.73 miles starting at US 70 to just south of Beatty St. With the exception of a bridge over I-55 which is four lanes, the route is a five lane/divided four lane corridor. No new right of way (ROW) or temporary construction easements will be required. The project is being conducted as a STIP job and no Native American consultation is required.

An archeological and historic records review was conducted for this project. It included the Arkansas Archeological Survey (AAS) site files of documented Native American and historic archeological sites, structures or features and the Arkansas Historic Preservation Program (AHPP) recorded structures and site/properties files. The National Register of Historic Places (NRHP) eligibility status is determined by the AHPP but presented in three databases. The NRHP status for archeological sites is in the AAS database, the status for architectural sites is in the AHPP database and the ARDOT tracks the status for bridges.

The AAS site files revealed no sites within a half mile from the project area. The AHPP site files did not show any properties adjacent to the project corridor. Three bridges are along the corridor and are evaluated as not significant and not eligible for nomination for inclusion in the NRHP.

Other records reviewed included the 1825 General Land Office (GLO) plat for T6N-R9E, the 1936 Crittenden County highway map and a total of 14 versions of United States Geological Survey (USGS) quadrangles from 1916 to 1972. The GLO shows a nearby field and plots the railroad to the south but there are no cultural features adjacent to the corridor. The earlier USGS quadrangles show the area to be swampy and without nearby structures. The route in 1915 lies between the communities of Hulbert and Banzippi and extended to between the communities of Blanton and Briark. The county map shows the route lying between West Memphis and a cluster of buildings to the east that would correspond to Briark, which continues to be noted on the current USGS map.

All work will take place within disturbances now covered by paved surfaces with no cultural resources and bridges directly or indirectly impacted. As a result, this project is subject to the 1999 MOA (enclosed) and falls under the exempted Work Category "Reconstruction". The project is not considered an undertaking and requires no further archeological research, fieldwork or Section 106 review.

To Whom It May Concern:
