Dear Mr. Correa:

The Environmental Division has reviewed the referenced project and it falls within the definition of the Tier 3 Categorical Exclusion as defined by the ARDOT/FHWA Memorandum of Agreement on the processing of Categorical Exclusions. The following information is included for your review and, if acceptable, approval as the environmental documentation for this project.

The purpose of this project is to rehabilitate a portion of Highway 53 in Clark County. Work will include mill and inlay of the roadway in the curb and gutter section of the highway and overlay on the remaining roadway. The existing cross-section will not change as a result of the proposed project and no additional right of way will be required. A project location map is enclosed.

There are no relocations, wetlands, hazardous materials, or prime farmland impacts associated with this project. No impacts to cultural resources are anticipated; concurrence from the State Historic Preservation Officer is enclosed.

The US Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) Information for Planning and Conservation (IPaC) website lists five federally protected species as potentially affected by the project; American burying beetle (*Nicrophorus americanus*), Ouachita Rock Pocketbook (*Arcidens wheeleri*), Pink Mucket (pearlymussel) (*Lampsilis abrupta*), Rabbitsfoot (*Theliderma cylindrica*), and Winged Mapleleaf (*Quadrula fragosa*). Due to the limited scope of the project and special provision for water pollution protections, a determination of 'may affect but not likely to adversely affect' was made for this project.

The USFWS concurred with our determination on October 30, 2017. The species list and concurrence are enclosed.

IPaC also listed Piping Plover (*Charadrius melodus*) as a species potentially affected by the proposed project, but due to the limited scope of the project, lack of habitat present within the project area, and distance to known habitat, a determination was made that the project will not affect this listed species.

Based upon the ARDOT's Policy on Highway Traffic Noise Abatement, a noise analysis is not required for this project. This project does not involve added capacity, construction of new through lanes or auxiliary lanes, changes in the horizontal or vertical alignment of the roadway, or exposure of noise sensitive land uses to a new or existing highway noise source.



The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (Service) is responding to your request dated October 23, 2017, regarding Arkansas Department of Transportation (ARDOT) Job Number 070271 I-30 - Nevada Co. Hwy 53 pavement preservation consisting of mill and inlay and overlay in Clark County, Arkansas. The project was described and assessed as follows (abbreviated):

The project will consist of mill and inlay and overlay (Hwy 53) near the Little Missouri River. In addition to the normal best management practices, the attached Special Provision will be added to the contract as conservation measures to minimize potential effects to listed resources.

ARDOT is requesting concurrence with the determination that the project "may affect but is not likely to adversely affect" the listed species.

The following species were identified by the Information for Planning and Consultation (IPaC) website as occurring in the vicinity of this action:

There is a total of 6 threatened, endangered, or candidate species on this species list. Species on this list should be considered in an effects analysis for your project and could include species that exist in another geographic area.

Ouachita Rock Pocketbook Arkansia wheeleri Pink Mucket (pearlymussel) Lampsilis abrupta Winged Mapleleaf Quadrula fragosa Piping Plover Charadrius melodus American Burying Beetle Nicrophorus americanus

Due to the limited scope of the action (i.e., paving existing roadway), minimal adjacent habitat effect, distance to known species locations, the standard special provision for sediment control, and the special provision for management of water pollution, the Service concurs

with the determination of "may affect, not likely to adversely affect" for Ouachita Rock Pocketbook, Pink Mucket, Winged Mapleleaf, Piping Plover, and American Burying Beetle. There is no data indicating the presence of Piping Plover occurrence in the vicinity of this action; furthermore, this species does not occur in the habitat type within the affected area of this action. No further consultation regarding these species is necessary at this time.

To Whom It May Concern:

The enclosed species list identifies endangered, threatened, proposed, and candidate species, as well as proposed and final designated critical habitat, that may occur within the boundary of your proposed project and/or may be affected by your proposed project. The species list fulfills the requirements of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (Service) under section 7(c) of the Endangered Species Act (Act) of 1973, as amended (16 U.S.C. 1531 et seq.). This letter only provides an official species list and technical assistance; if you determine that listed species and/or designated critical habitat may be affected in any way by the proposed project, even if the effect is wholly beneficial, consultation with the Service will be necessary.

The purpose of the Act is to provide a means whereby threatened and endangered species and the ecosystems upon which they depend may be conserved. Under sections 7(a)(1) and 7(a)(2) of the Act and its implementing regulations (50 CFR 402 et seq.), federal agencies are required to utilize their authorities to carry out programs for the conservation of threatened and endangered species and to determine whether projects may affect threatened and endangered species and/or designated critical habitat. If your species list includes any mussels, Northern Long-eared Bat, Indiana Bat, Yellowcheek Darter, Red-cockaded Woodpecker, or American Burying Beetle, your project may require a presence/absence and/or habitat survey prior to commencing project activities. Please check the appropriate species-specific guidance on our website to determine if your project requires a survey. We strongly recommend that you contact the appropriate staff species lead biologist (see office directory or species page) prior to conducting presence/absence surveys to ensure the appropriate level of effort and methodology.

Under the ESA, it is the responsibility of the Federal action agency or its designated representative to determine if a proposed action "may affect" endangered, threatened, or proposed species, or designated critical habitat, and if so, to consult with the Service further. Similarly, it is the responsibility of the Federal action agency or project proponent, not the Service, to make "no effect" determinations. If you determine that your proposed action will have "no effect" on threatened or endangered species or their respective critical habitat, you do not need to seek concurrence with the Service. Nevertheless, it is a violation of Federal law to harm or harass any federally-listed threatened or endangered fish or wildlife species without the appropriate permit.

Through the consultation process, we will analyze information contained in a biological assessment that you provide. If your proposed action is associated with Federal funding or permitting, consultation will occur with the Federal agency under section 7(a)(2) of the ESA. Otherwise, an incidental take permit pursuant to section 10(a)(1)(B) of the ESA (also known as a habitat conservation plan) is necessary to harm or harass federally listed threatened or endangered fish or wildlife species. In either case, there is no mechanism for authorizing incidental take "after-the-fact." For more information regarding formal consultation and HCPs, please see the Service's Consultation Handbook and Habitat Conservation Plans at www.fws.gov/endangered/esa-library/index.html#consultations.

New information based on updated surveys, changes in the abundance and distribution of species, changed habitat conditions, or other factors could change this list. Please feel free to contact us if you need more current information or assistance regarding the potential impacts to federally proposed, listed, and candidate species and federally designated and proposed critical habitat. Please note that under 50 CFR 402.12(e) of the regulations implementing section 7 of the Act, the accuracy of this species list should be verified after 90 days.
