Tier 2 Categorical Exclusion

The Environmental Division reviewed the referenced project and has determined it falls within the definition of a Tier 2 Categorical Exclusion under 23 Code of Federal Regulations, Section 771.117, and the ARDOT/FHWA Memorandum of Agreement on the processing of Categorical Exclusions.

The purpose of this project is to replace a deficient bridge over Shilcotts Bayou on Highway 176. The total project length is 0.08 mile. A project location map is attached.

The existing bridge (M2222) is a 22' x 42' structure. Highway 176 has two 11' paved travel lanes, an 11' two-way left turn lane, and no shoulders. The existing right of way width is 90'.

The new structure will be a quintuple 95' x 6' x 5' reinforced concrete box culvert on existing location. Detours and scheduling major construction activities during weekends and off-peak hours will be used to maintain traffic during construction. The proposed approaches will have two 12' paved travel lanes, a 12' two-way left turn lane, and 1' paved shoulders. In addition to typical curb and gutter on both sides of the roadway, a 3' berm and 5' sidewalk will be constructed on the left (west) side. Approximately 0.2 acre of new right of way and 0.04 acre of

temporary construction easement will be acquired. The new right of way width will be 140'.

Design data for this project is as follows:

There are no relocations, wetlands, prime farmland, environmental justice issues, hazardous materials, or cultural resources associated with this project. Concurrence from the State Historic Preservation Officer is attached. This project has been determined to generate minimal air quality impacts for Clean Air Act criteria pollutants and has not been linked with any special mobile source air toxic (MSAT) concerns.

Based on the ARDOT's noise policy, a noise analysis is not required for this project. The replacement of a bridge on existing location does not involve added capacity or expose noise sensitive land uses to a new or existing highway noise source. In compliance with federal guidelines, local authorities will not require notification.

Construction of this project will replace the existing structure located at station 108+27 with a quintuple barrel concrete box culvert. Shilcotts Bayou is classified as a perennial stream and impacts are estimated to be less than 0.1 acre. Construction should be allowed under the terms of a Nationwide Permit 14 for Linear Transportation Projects as defined in the Federal Register 82(4):1860 - 2008.

The official species list obtained from the United States Fish and Wildlife Service identified one endangered species, one threatened species, and one candidate species as potentially occurring within the project boundaries. The Piping Plover (*Charadrius melodus*), running buffalo clover (*Trifolium stoloniferum*), and rattlesnake-master borer moth (*Papaipema eryngii*) were identified as species that may occur in the proposed project location. Based on the lack of suitable habitat in the project area and scope of the project, it has been determined that the project will have "no effect" on all listed species.

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Pulaski County participates in the National Flood Insurance Program. Most of the project lies within Zone AE Special Flood Hazard Area. The final project design will be reviewed to confirm that the design is adequate and that the potential risk to life and property are minimized. Adjacent properties should not be impacted nor have a greater flood risk than existed before project construction. None of the encroachments will constitute a substantial floodplain encroachment or risk to property or life.

A Public Involvement meeting was held on January 24, 2019; the meeting synopsis is attached.

The staff of the Arkansas Historic Preservation Program (AHPP) has reviewed the documents included with your letter of January 23, 2019.

We continue to concur that Properties 1-10 are not eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP). Therefore, based on the previous correspondence with the AHPP, the archeological survey information provided with the PIF, and the project description, we concur that the proposed undertaking will have no effect on historic properties.

Tribes that have expressed an interest in the area include the Caddo Nation (Ms. Tamara Francis), the Cherokee Nation (Ms. Elizabeth Toombs), the Chickasaw Nation (Ms. Karen Brunso), the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma (Dr. Ian Thompson), the Jena Band of Choctaw Indians (Ms. Alina J. Shively), the Muscogee (Creek) Nation (Ms. Corain Lowe-Zepeda), the Osage Nation (Dr. Andrea Hunter), the Quapaw Nation of Oklahoma (Mr. Everett Bandy), and the Shawnee Tribe of Oklahoma (Ms. Tonya Tipton). We recommend that they be consulted in accordance with 36 CFR § 800.2 (c) (2).

PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT SYNOPSIS

Job Number 061506 Shilcotts Bayou Str. & Apprs. (S) Pulaski County Thursday, January 24, 2019

An open forum Public Involvement meeting for the proposed project was held at the Levy Church of Christ (Room 1001), 5124 Camp Robinson Road, North Little Rock, from 4:00-7:00 p.m. on Thursday, January 24, 2019. Efforts to involve minorities and the public in the meeting included:

- Display advertisement placed in *The Leader* on Wednesday, January 16 and 23, 2019.
- Display advertisement placed in *El Latino* on Thursday, January 17 and 24, 2019.
- Display advertisement placed in the *Arkansas Democrat Gazette* on Sunday, January 20, 2019.
- Public Service Announcement ran on Cumulus Power 92.3 FM from Monday, January 21 through Thursday, January 24, 2019.
- Outreach letters mailed to public officials.
- Distribution of flyers in the project area.

The purpose of the proposed project is to replace a structurally and hydraulically deficient bridge on Hwy. 176 with a reinforced concrete box culvert. The following information was available at the meeting for public review and comment:

- Displays of an aerial-based project location map (scale: 1 inch = 75 feet).
- Preliminary project design plans (scale: 1 inch = 50 feet).

Public handouts included a Citizen Comment Form and a small-scale project location map. Copies of the handouts are attached to this synopsis.

Table 1 summarizes public participation at the meeting.

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ARDOT staff reviewed and evaluated all comments received. The summary below reflects the perception or opinion of the person or organization making the comment(s). The order in which the comments are listed is random and does not reflect the number of times comments were made or their significance. Not all commenters responded to every Comment Form question, and some responses were ambiguous. A few of the comments were combined and/or paraphrased to simplify this synopsis.

Table 2 summarizes responses to Citizen Comment Form questions.

Comments regarding why the bridge replacement is needed included to prevent flooding and provide sidewalks.

Comments regarding how the project could better serve the needs of the community included:

- Provide pedestrian- or bicycle-only infrastructure, including pedestrian crossings, sidewalks on both sides of the roadway, and/or painted bicycle lanes.
- Provide accommodations for public transit users due to the presence of a Rock Region METRO bus stop in the project area.
- Retain the small bridge at 54th St. and Camp Robinson Road to provide pedestrian access to Camp Robinson Park (Park) and keep them off the roadway; bollards could be installed to prevent vehicles from accessing the small bridge.

Comments regarding beneficial impacts included decreasing flooding and increasing pedestrian access to the Park.

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Comments regarding adverse impacts included concerns about increased flooding in residential yards.

One comment regarding the permanent road closure of 54th Street indicated the closure would make side driveway exits dangerous for a resident.

A Rock Region METRO transit planner expressed the following additional comments/concerns: the project design does not provide adequate safety provisions for public transit users, pedestrians, and bicyclists; desire for ARDOT to partner with Rock Region METRO with the goal of making safety improvements for all forms of transportation across ARDOT's urban highway network in Central Arkansas; request that ARDOT include Rock Region METRO in preliminary design stage for future projects involving roadways served by Rock Region METRO; and painted crosswalks with signage in the project area are needed.


