The Environmental Division reviewed the referenced project and has determined it falls within the definition of the Tier 3 Categorical Exclusion as defined by the ARDOT/FHWA Programmatic Agreement on the processing of Categorical Exclusions. The following information is included for your review and, if acceptable, approval as the environmental documentation for this project.

The purpose of this project is to replace the Blue Bayou Bridge (#21810) with a box culvert along County Road 1 (Cornbridge Rd.) in Howard County, Arkansas. Total length of the project is 0.08 mile. A project location map is attached.

The existing roadway consists of two 11' wide paved travel lanes with no shoulders and a right of way width of 50'. The existing bridge is a corrugated steel span structure.

The proposed roadway will consist of two 11' wide paved travel lanes with 4' wide gravel shoulders. The bridge will be replaced with a quintuple 12' x 12' x 54' steel reinforced concrete box culvert. County Road 1 will be closed to accommodate construction of the new box culvert. The new right of way width will vary from 70' – 110'. Approximately 0.9 acre of new right of way and 0.2 acre of temporary construction easements will be required for this project. Of this acreage, approximately 0.3 acre of prime farmland will be impacted. The NRCS-CPA-106 Form is attached.

There are no relocations, environmental justice issues, protected waters, or public recreation lands associated with this project. Field inspections found no evidence of existing underground storage tanks or hazardous waste deposits. State Historic Preservation Officer clearance is attached.

The official species list obtained through US Fish and Wildlife Service's (USFWS) Information for Planning and Consultation website identifies the following federallylisted species as having the potential to occur in the project area: the threatened northern long-eared bat (*Myotis septentrionalis*), Piping Plover (*Charadrius* melodus), Red Knot (*Calidris canutus* rufa), and Rabbitsfoot (*Theliderma cylindrica*). The Final 4(d) Rule and Programmatic Biological Opinion (BO) applies to the project's activities that have the potential to affect northern long-eared bats. The Final 4(d) Rule exempts the incidental take of northern long-eared bats from take prohibitions in the Endangered Species Act. The exemptions apply as long as the activities do not occur within 0.25 mile of a known hibernaculum or within 150 feet of a known occupied maternity roost from June 1 to July 31. No known hibernacula or maternity roosts exist within the project limits. All offsite locations will require coordination with USFWS. See the attached Verification Letter.

The Arkansas statewide determination key reached the determination of "may affect, not likely to adversely affect" the Rabbitsfoot. Due to the lack of suitable habitat in the project area and distance to known populations, a "no effect" determination has been made for all other listed species.


Stream impacts to Blue Bayou are estimated at less than 200'. Wetland impacts to a small, depressional wetland are estimated at 0.04 acre. Construction of the proposed project should be allowed under the terms of a Nationwide 14 Section 404 Permit for Linear Transportation Projects as defined in the Federal Register 82(4):1860-2008.

Based on the ARDOT noise policy, a noise analysis is not required for this project. The bridge replacement will not involve adding capacity, substantially changing the roadway alignment, or exposing noise sensitive land uses to traffic noise sources. In compliance with federal guidelines, local authorities will not require notification.

Howard County participates in the National Flood Insurance Program. The projects lie within the Zone A Special Flood Hazard Area. The final project design will be reviewed to confirm that the design is adequate and that the potential risk to life and property are minimized. Adjacent properties should not be impacted nor have a greater flood risk than existed before construction of the project. None of the encroachments would constitute a substantial floodplain encroachment or a risk to property or life.

This project has been determined to generate minimal air quality impacts for Clean Air Act criteria pollutants and has not been linked with any special mobile source air toxic (MSAT) concerns. As such, this project will not result in changes in traffic volumes, vehicle mix, basic project location, or any other factor that would cause a meaningful increase in MSAT impacts of the project from that of the no-build alternative.

No other adverse environmental impacts were identified. No public involvement will be needed for the project. The checklist used to verify consideration of potential environmental impacts is attached.

The staff of the Arkansas Historic Preservation Program (AHPP) reviewed the project identification form for the above-referenced job. The undertaking entails replacing County Bridge 21810 on Cornbridge Road west of Mineral Springs. The project requires an additional .91 acre. of right-of-way and .16 acre. of temporary construction easement. Bridge 21810 dates from 1997 and is not eligible for the National Register.

Based on the provided information and the negative results of the cultural resources investigation, the AHPP concurs with the finding of **no historic properties affected pursuant to 36 CFR § 800.4(d)(1)** for the proposed undertaking.

Tribes that have expressed an interest in the area include the Caddo Nation (Ms. Tamara Francis), the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma (Ms. Madison Currie), the Osage Nation (Dr. Andrea Hunter), the Quapaw Nation (Mr. Everett Bandy), and the Shawnee Tribe (Ms. Tonya Tipton). We recommend consultation in accordance with 36 CFR § 800.2(c)(2).
