The Environmental Division reviewed the referenced project and has determined it falls within the definition of the Tier 3 Categorical Exclusion as defined by the ARDOT/FHWA Memorandum of Agreement on the processing of Categorical Exclusions. The following information is included for your review and, if acceptable, approval as the environmental documentation for this project.

The purpose of this project is to replace the Highway 19 bridge (Bridge No. 03095) over the Little Missouri River in Nevada and Pike Counties, and repair the deck of the Highway 19 bridge (Bridge No. 06347) over the Little Missouri Relief in Nevada County. Total length of the project is 1.27 miles. A project location map is attached.

The existing roadway consists of two 12' wide paved travel lanes with 8' wide paved shoulders. Bridge No. 03095 is approximately 502' x 40' and Bridge No. 06347 is approximately 425' x 40'; both bridges are in poor condition. Existing right of way width varies from 100' to 240'.

The replacement bridge over the Little Missouri River will be approximately 502' x 40' and constructed adjacent to the existing bridge on the east side. The existing bridge will remain in place for traffic maintenance and removed after the new bridge is constructed. Recent fire damage to Bridge No. 06347 will be repaired. The roadway cross section will not be modified. The average proposed right of way width will vary from 100' to 280'. Approximately 2.09 acres of additional right of way will be required for this project.

There are no relocations, wetlands, public water supplies, environmental justice concerns, underground storage tanks/hazardous wastes, or cultural resources associated with this project. State Historic Preservation Officer clearance is attached. Approximately 0.27 acre of Prime Farmland will be converted to highway right of way. Form NRCS-CPA-106 is attached. This project has been determined to generate minimal air quality impacts for Clean Air Act criteria pollutants and has not been linked with any special mobile source air toxic (MSAT) concerns.


Based on the ARDOT's noise policy, a noise analysis is not required for this project. The project does not involve added capacity, substantial changes in the horizontal or vertical alignment of the roadway, or exposure of noise sensitive land uses to a new or existing traffic noise source. In compliance with federal guidelines, local authorities will not require notification.

Nevada and Pike Counties participate in the National Flood Insurance Program. The project is located in Zone A, Special Flood Hazard Area. The final project design will be reviewed to confirm that the design is adequate and that the potential risk to life and property are minimized. Adjacent properties should not be impacted nor have a greater flood risk than existed before project construction. None of the encroachments will constitute a substantial floodplain encroachment or a risk to property or life.

The official species list obtained through the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service's (USFWS) Information for Planning and Consultation (IPaC) website lists northern long-eared bat (*Myotis septentrionalis*), Ouachita Rock Pocketbook (*Arcidens wheeleri*), Pink Mucket, (*Lampsilis abrupta*), Rabbitsfoot (*Theliderma cylindrica*), and Winged Mapleleaf (*Quadrula fragosa*) as species potentially affected by the proposed project. ARDOT personnel surveyed the area for mussels and found one *Alasmidonta marginata*, two undescribed *Lampsilis* species, and two *Vilosa lienosa*. The nearest known location with listed species is >20 miles downstream (AR mussel database) of the Determination Key within IPaC, a "may affect" determination with no prohibited take was made for the northern long-eared bat. The official species list and 4(d) rule verification letters are attached. Based on negative survey results, distance to known populations of listed species, and the use of appropriate erosion and sediment control, a determination of "may affect, not likely to adversely affect" was made for the remaining listed species. The USFWS concurrence is attached.

The project will have a discharge of dredged or fill material into waters of the U.S. associated with the new bridge; therefore, a Section 404 permit will be required. The project should be authorized by Nationwide Permit 23 for Approved Categorical Exclusions as defined in Federal Register 82(4): 1860-2008.

No other adverse environmental impacts were identified. The checklist used to verify consideration of potential environmental impacts is attached.

Thank you for your email of June 4, 2019. The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (Service) is responding to your request regarding Job Number 030458 Little Missouri River & Relief Strs. & Apprs., replacing the Hwy. 19 Bridge over the Little Missouri River and repairing the relief bridge, Nevada and Pike Counties, Arkansas. The project was described and assessed as follows (abbreviated and summarized):

ArDOT is replacing the Hwy. 19 Bridge over the Little Missouri River and repairing the relief bridge. The new bridge will be on new alignment adjacent to the east of the current one.

The official species list obtained through the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service's (USFWS) Information for Planning and Consultation (IPaC) website lists Northern Long-eared Bat (Myotis septentrionalis), Ouachita Rock Pocketbook (Arcidens wheeleri), Pink Mucket, (Lampsilis abrupta), Rabbitsfoot (Theliderma cylindrica), and Winged Mapleleaf (Quadrula fragosa) as species potentially affected by the proposed project. ArDOT personnel surveyed the area for mussels and found one Alasmidonta marginata, two undescribed Lampsilis species, and two Vilosa lienosa. The nearest known location with listed species is >20 miles downstream (AR mussel database).

Based on the results of the Determination Key within IPaC, a "may affect" determination with no prohibited take was made for the Northern Long-eared Bat. The 4(d) rule verification letter is attached. Based on negative survey results, distance to known populations of listed species, and the use of appropriate erosion and sediment control, a determination of "may affect, not likely to adversely affect" the remaining listed species.

ArDOT is requesting concurrence with this determination.

The Service has reviewed your determination that the proposed action will not result in any prohibited incidental take for Northern Long-eared Bat. This project may affect the Northern Long-eared Bat; however, there are no effects beyond those previously disclosed in the Service's Mr. John Fleming

programmatic biological opinion for the final 4(d) rule dated January 5, 2016. Any taking that may occur incidental to this project is not prohibited under the final 4(d) rule (50 CFR§17.40(o)).

This project is consistent with the description of the proposed action in the programmatic biological opinion, and the 4(d) rule does not prohibit incidental take of the Northern Long-eared Bat that may occur as a result of this project. Therefore, the programmatic biological opinion satisfies the "action agency" responsibilities under ESA section 7(a)(2) relative to the Northern Long-eared Bat for this project.

Please keep in mind that you must report any departures from the plans submitted; results of any surveys conducted; or any dead, injured, or sick Northern Long-eared Bats that are found to this office. If this project is not completed within one year of this letter, you must update your determination and resubmit the required information.

Based on the negative survey results, location of this action, the minimal habitat being affected immediately adjacent to existing roadway bridges and right of way, the distance to known species locations and suitable habitat, and application of standard sediment and erosion controls; the Service agrees with your assessment and concurs with your determinations of "may affect, not likely to adversely affect" for the listed species identified.



The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (Service) received on June 04, 2019 your effects determination for the '030458 - Little Missouri River & Relief Strs. & Apprs. (S)' (the Action) using the northern long-eared bat (*Myotis septentrionalis*) key within the Information for Planning and Consultation (IPaC) system. This IPaC key assists users in determining whether a Federal action is consistent with the activities analyzed in the Service's January 5, 2016, Programmatic Biological Opinion (PBO). The PBO addresses activities excepted from "take" prohibitions applicable to the northern long-eared bat under the Endangered Species Act of 1973 (ESA) (87 Stat.884, as amended; 16 U.S.C. 1531 et seq.).

Based upon your IPaC submission, the Action is consistent with activities analyzed in the PBO. The Action may affect the northern long-eared bat; however, any take that may occur as a result of the Action is not prohibited under the ESA Section 4(d) rule adopted for this species at 50 CFR §17.40(o). Unless the Service advises you within 30 days of the date of this letter that your IPaC-assisted determination was incorrect, this letter verifies that the PBO satisfies and concludes your responsibilities for this Action under ESA Section 7(a)(2) with respect to the northern long-eared bat.

Please report to our office any changes to the information about the Action that you submitted in IPaC, the results of any bat surveys conducted in the Action area, and any dead, injured, or sick northern long-eared bats that are found during Action implementation. If the Action is not completed within one year of the date of this letter, you must update and resubmit the information required in the IPaC key.

This IPaC-assisted determination allows you to rely on the PBO for compliance with ESA Section 7(a)(2) only for the northern long-eared bat. It **does not** apply to the following ESA-protected species that also may occur in the Action area:

- Ouachita Rock Pocketbook, *Arkansia wheeleri* (Endangered)


