Randal Looney Environmental Coordinator Federal Highway Administration The Arkansas Department of Transportation (ARDOT) Environmental Division reviewed the referenced project and determined it falls within the definition of the Tier 3 Categorical Exclusion as defined by the ARDOT/FHWA Memorandum of Agreement on the processing of Categorical Exclusions.

The ARDOT is proposing to replace three bridges: Bridge Number (No.) 02082 in Sevier and Howard Counties, Bridge No. 03089 on Highway (Hwy.) 70 in Pike County, and Bridge No. 03602 on Hwy. 278 in Howard County. Bridge Nos. 02082 and 03602 cross the Saline River and Bridge No. 03089 crosses the Caddo River. These three bridges are hereinafter referred to as the Hwy. 70 Saline River, Caddo River, and Hwy. 278 Saline River sites. The bridge replacements were originally programmed as separate projects. These separate projects were subsequently combined into a single project for bidding and letting purposes.

Project location maps are attached. The purpose of the proposed project is to improve safety and mobility at each crossing by replacing the current bridge structures. The overall ROW width varies within each site but is typically 80' to 200'. The approximate total length of the Caddo River and Hwy. 278 Saline River sites is 0.6 mile. The approximate total length of the Hwy. 70 Saline River site is 0.7 mile.

The table below presents the design year traffic volumes and design speeds for each of the bridge replacement sites.

The Hwy. 70 Saline River site currently has two 12' wide travel lanes and 6' wide shoulders along the eastern and western approaches. The proposed project would

include the reconstruction and realignment of the bridge, approaches, and adjacent driveways. The approach shoulders would be widened to 8'.

The Caddo River site currently has two 12' wide travel lanes and shoulders that vary between 7' and 10' wide along the eastern and western approaches and side streets. The proposed project would include the reconstruction and realignment of the bridge, approaches, and side streets. Proposed improvements would also include addition of a 12' wide center turn lane and 5' wide sidewalks with curb and gutter along both sides of the highway.

The Hwy. 278 Saline River site currently has two 10' wide travel lanes with 4' unpaved shoulders along the northern and southern approaches. The proposed project would include the reconstruction and realignment of the bridge, approaches, and adjacent driveways. Proposed improvements would also include widening the travel lanes to 11' and adding 6' wide (4' gravel, 2' paved) shoulders along the reconstructed travel lanes.

ROW

The proposed bridge replacements and roadway improvements would occur primarily within the existing ROW; however, the construction of the proposed projects is anticipated to require approximately 2.75 acres of additional ROW and include 0.18 acre of temporary construction easements to maintain access to existing driveways and side streets along the project areas. Additional details of the ROW and temporary construction easement requirements for each of the bridge replacement sites are attached.

Wetlands and Streams

A total of three wetland areas and five stream crossings were identified within the project areas for the proposed bridge replacements. The proposed project is expected to permanently impact 1 acre of wetlands and 79 linear feet of streams. Compensatory mitigation for unavoidable wetland and stream impacts will occur at an approved mitigation bank. The final compensatory wetland and stream mitigation will be determined during the Section 404 permitting process. Construction of the proposed project is expected to be authorized under three separate Section 404 permits. Based on project impacts at this time, it is expected that Nationwide Permit guidelines will apply to each of the bridge replacement sites. A Wetlands and Streams Assessment report for each of the three project

areas has been completed and are available upon request. A summary of the findings for each of the wetland and stream assessments is provided below.

Floodplains

Based on the limited available Floodplain Mapping for the Hwy. 70 Saline River and Caddo River sites, it appears that both project areas fall within the 100-year floodplain. At the Hwy. 278 Saline River site, the project area crosses the 100-year floodplain at two locations. Proposed improvements planned within the flood zones would involve short linear crossings with minor impacts. Every effort will be made during the final stages of design to minimize floodplain impacts. The final project design will be reviewed to confirm that the design will ensure risk to life and property are minimized. Adjacent properties should not be impacted nor have a greater flood risk than existed before construction of the project.

Wellhead Protection

The Arkansas Department of Health (ADH) was contacted for known public water supply concerns and Wellhead Protection Areas in the vicinities of the three bridge replacement projects. The ADH provided the locations of wells within a 5-mile radius of each of the project areas and identified one water source, Dierks Waterworks, approximately 3.5 miles from the Hwy. 70 Saline River site. The ADH also identified one water source, Glenwood Water Department, approximately 0.5 mile from the Caddo River site. A Wellhead Protection Special Provision will be included in the final construction documents. No impacts to public water systems are anticipated.

Threatened and Endangered Species

ARDOT coordinated with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service's (USFWS) Arkansas Ecological Services Field Office regarding the potential effects to federally listed species posed by the proposed project. The USFWS listed three threatened and four endangered species that may occur within the boundary of the proposed project or that may be affected by the proposed project. Based on negative survey results, the locations of the proposed actions, the minimal habitat being affected immediately adjacent to existing bridges and ROW, the distance to known species locations and suitable habitat, and application of standard sediment and erosion controls, the USFWS concurred with the determinations of "may affect, not likely to adversely affect" for the listed species identified. The USFWS species lists and coordination letters are attached.

Cultural Resources

A Phase I archeological survey was conducted for the project and no historic properties eligible or on the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP) were found in the Area of Potential Effect. No further archaeological work was recommended within the project areas. No impacts to cultural resources are anticipated. The State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO) clearance letter is attached.

Prime Farmland

The proposed replacement at the Hwy. 70 Saline River site would convert 0.33 acre of Prime Farmland to highway right of way. The proposed replacement at the Hwy. 278 Saline River site would convert 1.45 acres of Prime Farmland to highway right of way. The replacement at the Caddo River site would have no impacts on Prime Farmland. The NRCS-CPA-106 Forms (attached) for the Hwy. 70 and Hwy. 278 Saline River sites were completed and indicated that no further coordination with the NRCS is required.

Section 4(f)/6(f)

A database review and field investigation of the project areas for Section 4(f) and Section 6(f) properties revealed no potential impacts to either type of land resource.

Environmental Justice/Title VI

Based on the proposed project footprints, available census data, project area reviews, and field investigations, no disproportionate impacts to low-income, elderly, or minority groups are anticipated.

Air Quality

This project has been determined to generate minimal air quality impacts for Clean Air Act criteria pollutants and has not been linked with any special mobile source air toxic (MSAT) concerns. As such, this project will not result in changes in traffic volumes, vehicle mix, basic project location, or any other factor that would cause a meaningful increase in MSAT impacts of the project from that of the no-build alternative.

Noise Levels

The project areas for the Hwy. 70 and Hwy. 278 Saline River sites have no noise sensitive receptors in the vicinity that would be impacted by noise. Additionally, the mainline roads will not be widened to add additional travel lanes and the bridges will be striped to maintain their current two-lane capacity. Therefore, the construction of these two bridges is exempt from a Type I Noise Analysis.


For the Caddo River site, there are residences and a recreational area near the bridge. However, since this project is not a capacity-adding project does not include improvements that would reduce the distance of the proposed facility by greater than 50% of the existing facility, it is also exempt from a Type I Noise Analysis.


Hazardous Materials

A hazardous materials radius report was ordered for the Caddo River site from GeoSearch, Inc. on April 23, 2018, to determine the proximity of known and potential contaminant sources. Due to their rural locations and distance from any other development, radius reports for the Hwy. 70 and Hwy. 278 Saline River sites were not ordered. No evidence of potential contamination was observed during the site visits for each of the three sites. The GeoSearch Radius Report is available upon request.


Public Involvement






Saline & Caddo River Bridge Replacements ARDOT Job No. 030501 Project Location Map April 2019













Hwy. 70 Caddo River Crossing


Bridge No. 03089 Replacement Project Location Map






Bridge No. 03602 Replacement **Project Location Map April 2019**

This letter is in reference to your March 7, 2019, submittal regarding the Arkansas Department of Transportation's (ARDOT) proposal to replace three bridges on the Saline and Caddo Rivers on Hwy. 70 and Hwy. 278 in Howard, Pike and Sevier counties. Based upon the information submitted, and assuming ARDOT is among the agencies contacted regarding this project, the Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ) does not have any specific objections at this time.

It is reminded, if the construction site will disturb in excess of one (1) acre, the permittee must comply with the terms of the Stormwater Construction General Permit ARR150000 prior to the start of construction. The ARR150000 does not authorize any activity to be conducted in Waters of the State or Waters of the United States.

Any work being conducted in Waters of the State will require a Short Term Activity Authorization (STAA) from ADEQ in accordance with Regulation 2.305. A STAA is necessary for any in-stream activity that may cause an exceedance of applicable water quality standards. Any work being conducted in Waters of the United States may require a Section 404 permit from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. All applicable State and Federal laws must be met before, during, and after completion of the project.

Thank you for your email of March 3, 2019. The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (Service) is responding to your request, regarding Job Number 030501, which includes three structures and approaches jobs over the Caddo River and Saline River on Hwy 70 and the Saline River above the Dierks Reservoir on Hwy 278 in Pike, Howard, and Sevier Counties, Arkansas. The project was described and assessed as follows (abbreviated and summarized):

Hwy 70 Caddo River includes the following species as possibly affected: Northern Long-eared Bat (*Myotis septentrionalis*), Arkansas Fatmucket, (*Lampsilis powellii*), Ouachita Rock Pocketbook (*Arcidens wheeleri*), Rabbitsfoot (*Theliderma cylindrica*), and Spectaclecase (*Cumberlandia monodonta*). ArDOT personnel surveyed the area for mussels and found one *Strophitus undulatus* and two *Vilosa iris*. The nearest known location with listed species is ~5 miles downstream (AR mussel (database)).

Hwy 70 Saline River includes the following species as possibly affected: Northern Long-eared Bat (*Myotis septentrionalis*), Pink Mucket, (*Lampsilis abrupta*), Ouachita Rock Pocketbook (*Arcidens wheeleri*), Rabbitsfoot (*Theliderma cylindrica*), and Scaleshell (*Leptodea leptodon*). ArDOT personnel surveyed the area for mussels and found seven species and a total of 18 individuals. *Actinonaias ligamentina* and *Amblema plicata* accounted for 11 of the 18. The nearest known location with listed species is ~6 miles downstream (database).

Hwy 278 Saline River includes the following species as possibly affected: Northern Long-eared Bat (Myotis septentrionalis), Pink Mucket, (Lampsilis abrupta), Ouachita Rock Pocketbook (Arcidens wheeleri), Rabbitsfoot (Theliderma cylindrica), and Scaleshell (Leptodea leptodon). ArDOT personnel surveyed the area for mussels and found a single Ptychobranchus occidentalis. No listed species are known above the Dierks Reservoir (AR mussel database). Based on negative survey results, distance to known populations of listed species, use of appropriate erosion and sediment control, ArDOT believes any affects

would be insignificant or discountable. ArDOT is seeking concurrence with the determination of "may affect, not likely to adversely affect" these species at these sites.

The Service has reviewed your determination that the proposed action will not result in any prohibited incidental take for Northern Long-eared Bat. This project may affect the Northern Long-eared Bat; however, there are no effects beyond those previously disclosed in the Service's programmatic biological opinion for the final 4(d) rule dated January 5, 2016. Any taking that may occur incidental to this project is not prohibited under the final 4(d) rule (50 CFR§17.40(o)).

This project is consistent with the description of the proposed action in the programmatic biological opinion, and the 4(d) rule does not prohibit incidental take of the Northern Long-eared Bat that may occur as a result of this project. Therefore, the programmatic biological opinion satisfies the "action agency" responsibilities under ESA section 7(a)(2) relative to the Northern Long-eared Bat for this project.

Please keep in mind that you must report any departures from the plans submitted; results of any surveys conducted; or any dead, injured, or sick Northern Long-eared Bats that are found to this office. If this project is not completed within one year of this letter, you must update your determination and resubmit the required information.

Based on the negative survey results, location of this action, the minimal habitat being affected immediately adjacent to existing roadway bridges and right of way, the distance to known species locations and suitable habitat, and application of standard sediment and erosion controls; the Service agrees with your assessment and concurs with your determinations of "may affect, not likely to adversely affect" for the listed species identified.

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (Service) received on April 25, 2019 your effects determination for the '030501 Saline & Caddo Rivers Strs. & Apprs. 

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (Service) received on April 25, 2019 your effects determination for the '030501 Saline & Caddo Rivers Strs. & Apprs. (S) - Hwy 278 Saline River' (the Action) using the northern long-eared bat (*Myotis septentrionalis*) key within the Information for Planning and Consultation (IPaC) system. This IPaC key assists users in determining whether a Federal action is consistent with the activities analyzed in the Service's January 5, 2016, Programmatic Biological Opinion (PBO). The PBO addresses activities excepted from "take" prohibitions applicable to the northern long-eared bat under the Endangered Species Act of 1973 (ESA) (87 Stat.884, as amended; 16 U.S.C. 1531 et seq.).

Based upon your IPaC submission, the Action is consistent with activities analyzed in the PBO. The Action may affect the northern long-eared bat; however, any take that may occur as a result of the Action is not prohibited under the ESA Section 4(d) rule adopted for this species at 50 CFR §17.40(o). Unless the Service advises you within 30 days of the date of this letter that your IPaC-assisted determination was incorrect, this letter verifies that the PBO satisfies and concludes your responsibilities for this Action under ESA Section 7(a)(2) with respect to the northern long-eared bat.

Please report to our office any changes to the information about the Action that you submitted in IPaC, the results of any bat surveys conducted in the Action area, and any dead, injured, or sick northern long-eared bats that are found during Action implementation. If the Action is not completed within one year of the date of this letter, you must update and resubmit the information required in the IPaC key.

This IPaC-assisted determination allows you to rely on the PBO for compliance with ESA Section 7(a)(2) only for the northern long-eared bat. It **does not** apply to the following ESA-protected species that also may occur in the Action area:

The Arkansas Natural Heritage Commission maintains a database of information on the known locations of species of conservation concern in Arkansas. This includes species listed as endangered or threatened under the Endangered Species Act as well as species of state concern. The database was developed to help the agency meet its mission of identifying and protecting natural areas in the state. The information is made available to outside users through the Agency's Environmental Review/Information sharing program. County level information is available on the agency's web page, but site specific location information is only available through the Environmental Review/Information Sharing program. Two options for project review are offered:

- 1. A project may be handled as an "information request." If handled under this option, a 2-week review period will be assigned to the project. A detailed database search will be conducted and a response prepared. The response will include the results of the data search, as well as a county element list that has been annotated to indicate those sensitive species known to occur within a 1 and 5 mile radius of the project site. The requestor will receive a response from the agency whether the agency has particular concerns or not. There is a charge for this service, please visit. our web page for a full fee schedule: (http://naturalheritage.com/program/data-requests.asp). Typically small projects run \$30.00-\$60.00. Users will receive an invoice with the project response. This option provides a detailed project review, a two-week "turn-around" time (very large projects may take longer), and a definitive response.
- 2. A project may be submitted to the agency as an "opportunity for review." If handled under this option, a 3-4 week review period will be assigned to the project. If the agency has no concerns about the proposal, project papers will be filed without comments. The agency will make no response to the requestor unless it has specific concerns. If desired, the requestor may contact the agency to find out the disposition of the project. As evidence that the review has been conducted, the requestor will be given the "ANHC Number" for the project. This is a unique identifying number assigned by the agency to each project it handles. A project handled as an "opportunity to review" is typically given a lower priority than an information request, time frames are likely to be much longer, and the responsibility to verify that a review has been conducted falls solely upon the requestor. There is no charge for this option.

Requestors should clearly identify in a cover letter which review option they prefer. To handle reviews and requests efficiently, we prefer to receive a map depicting the project area boundaries delineated on a copy of a 1:24,000 topographic map or an ArcView shapefile of the project area (this speeds up the data search). If this is not available, we will need to receive at least the township, range, and section (1/4 section if possible) of the review site or latitude and longitude coordinates. Because our data is stored on topographic maps, street addresses are much more difficult to search, which could add to overall costs for information requests or time for reviews.

Reviews for cultural resources (historice structures or archeological sites) are handled by the Arkansas Historic Preservation Program (AHPP), another agency of the Department of Arkansas Heritage. The staff of the Arkansas Historic Preservation Program (AHPP) has reviewed the documents included with your letter of January 7, 2019.

We continue to concur that ARDOT Bridge #02082 on Route 70 is not eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP).

We continue to concur that ARDOT Bridge #03089 on Route 70 is not eligible for listing in the NRHP.

Finally, we continue to concur that ARDOT Bridge #03602 on Route 278 is not eligible for listing in the NRHP. Additionally, we concur that archeology site 3HO0232 is not eligible for the NRHP.

Therefore, we have determined that this undertaking will have no effect to historic properties.

Tribes that have expressed an interest in the area include the Caddo Nation (Ms. Tamara Francis), the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma (Dr. Ian Thompson), the Jena Band of Choctaw Indians (Ms. Alina J. Shively), the Quapaw Nation of Oklahoma (Mr. Everett Bandy), the Shawnee Tribe of Oklahoma (Ms. Tonya Tipton), and the United Keetoowah Band of Cherokee Indians (Ms. Sheila Bird). We recommend that they be consulted in accordance with 36 CFR § 800.2 (c) (2).

- Fifteen individuals were concerned with the existing curve on Hwy 8 north of Hwy 70 and would like the project limits to be expanded to address this issue.



Baked Ham with Brown Sugar Pineapple Glaze

1 cup brown sugar, packed; 1 tbs. cornstarch; 1 tbs. prepared mustard; 1 (15 oz.) can pineapple slices, drained and juice reserved; 1 (4 oz.) jar maraschino cherries (optional); 6-8 pound fully cooked, bone-in ham

Place ham, fat side up, on a rack in shallow roasting pan. Insert meat thermometer (not instant read) through the end of the ham so the tip is in the center of the thickest part of the ham but does not touch the bone or fat.

Roast 12 to 16 minutes per pound in 325°F degree oven or until thermometer reads

Remove ham from the oven. Pour drippings from roasting pan. Remove any skin from the ham. Cut top of ham lightly in uniform diamond shapes. Lay pineapple slices and cherries on top of ham. Drizzle half of the glaze on the ham. Roast uncovered about 20 minutes; add remaining glaze and roast 10 minutes more.

Cover ham with tent of aluminum foil, or roaster lid and let stand 10 minutes before

moving to serving plate and carving.

To make the glaze: In a heavy saucepan, mix brown sugar and cornstarch. Add reserved pineapple juice and prepared mustard; stir well.

Bring this mixture to a boil and continue to cook until the mixture has boiled for 1 minute.
