The Environmental Division reviewed the referenced project and has determined it falls within the definition of the Tier 3 Categorical Exclusion as defined by the ARDOT/FHWA Memorandum of Agreement on the processing of Categorical Exclusions. The following information is included for your review and, if acceptable, approval as the environmental documentation for this project.

The purpose of this project is to replace two bridges on Highway 212 over Bayou Derriseaux Relief and Bayou Derriseaux in Cleveland County. Total length of the project is 0.36 mile. A project location map is enclosed.

The existing roadway consists of two 10' wide paved travel lanes with no shoulders. The existing Bayou Derriseaux Relief Bridge (Structure #M3994) is 97' x 24'. The existing Bayou Derriseaux Bridge (Structure #M3995) is 229' x 24'. Existing right of way width averages 80'.

Proposed improvements consist of two 11' wide paved travel lanes with 4' wide shoulders (2' paved). Proposed improvements at M3994 include a new 91' x 33' concrete bridge. Bridge M3995 will consist of a 241' x 33' concrete bridge. The average additional right of way width at both bridges will be 100'. Approximately 1.9 acres of additional right of way and 2.5 acres of temporary construction easements will be required for this project.

There are no relocations, environmental justice issues, prime farmland, or floodplains associated with this project. Field inspections found no evidence of existing underground storage tanks or hazardous waste deposits. The State Historic Preservation Officer clearance is enclosed.

The official species list obtained through the US Fish and Wildlife Service's (USFWS) Information for Planning and Consultation website identifies the following species as possibly occurring in the project area: Geocarpon (Geocarpon minimum), Pink Mucket (Lampsilis abrupta), Rabbitsfoot (Theliderma cylindrica), and Winged Mapleleaf (Quadrula fragosa). A determination of 'no effect' was made for Geocarpon and the Winged Mapleleaf due to the lack of suitable habitat and known occurrences in the project area. A determination of 'may affect, not likely to adversely affect' was made for Pink Mucket and Rabbitsfoot. The USFWS


concurred on March 20, 2019. USFWS concurrence and the official species list are enclosed.

Impacts to waters of the United States include 1.4 acres of permanently filled wetlands and 3.0 acres of temporary impacts due to detours and clearing of trees during construction. Total permanent stream impacts are estimated at less than 0.2 acre for both bridges. Temporary stream impacts are estimated at less than 0.1 acre for both bridges. Compensatory mitigation will be provided for unavoidable wetland impacts at a US Army Corps of Engineers approved mitigation bank. Construction of the proposed project should be allowed under the terms of Nationwide 23 Section 404 Permit for Approved Categorical Exclusions as defined in Federal Register 82(4):1860-2008.

Noise predictions were made for this project using the FHWA Traffic Noise Model Version 2.5. The predicted noise level increases are below applicable noise impact criteria; therefore, noise impacts are not anticipated. In compliance with federal guidelines, local authorities will not require notification.

This project has been determined to generate minimal air quality impacts for Clean Air Act criteria pollutants and has not been linked with any special mobile source air toxic (MSAT) concerns. As such, this project will not result in changes in traffic volumes, vehicle mix, basic project location, or any other factor that would cause a meaningful increase in MSAT impacts of the project from that of the no-build alternative.

No other adverse environmental impacts were identified. The checklist used to verify consideration of potential environmental impacts is enclosed.

The staff of the Arkansas Historic Preservation Program (AHPP) reviewed the Project Identification Form for the above-referenced project. The proposed undertaking entails replacement of two bridges (M3394 and M3995) spanning Derriseaux Creek on Arkansas Highway 212 in Cleveland County. The proposed right-of-way (ROW) is 100 feet wide. Temporary construction easements will accommodate detours during the course of construction. The total length of the project is .36 miles.

The field investigation did not document any new archeological sites within the ROW. However, Site 3CV0009 is partially within the ROW. Sixteen shovel tests placed north and south of the highway proved negative for cultural materials. ARDOT archeologists did recover eight lithic flakes and debitage from the surface near a bridge abutment. Previous bridge construction, road grading of a proximal hunting camp road, and nonscientific excavations have significantly affected the portion of Site 3CV0009 within the ROW.

Based on the provided information, the AHPP concurs that Site 3CV0009 within the ROW is note eligible for inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP). The AHPP also concurs with the finding of no historic properties affected pursuant to 36 CFR § 800.4(d)(1) for the proposed undertaking.

Tribes that have expressed an interest in the area include the Caddo Nation (Ms. Tamara Francis), the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma (Mr. Daniel Ragle), the Jena Band of Choctaw Indians (Ms. Alina J. Shively), the Quapaw Nation (Mr. Everett Bandy), the Shawnee Tribe of Oklahoma (Ms. Tonya Tipton), and the United Keetoowah Band of Cherokee Indians (Ms. Erin Thompson

and Charlotte Wolfe). We recommend consultation in accordance with 36 CFR § 800.2(c)(2).



The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (Service) is responding to your request dated March 15, 2019, regarding Arkansas Department of Transportation (ArDOT) Job 070415, replacement of two bridges, both over Bayou Derriseaux, on Highway 212 in Cleveland County, Arkansas. The project was described and assessed as follows (abbreviated):

The Arkansas Department of Transportation (ArDOT) proposes to replace two bridges, both over Bayou Derriseaux, on Highway 212 in Cleveland County. Both bridges will be replaced on existing location and will utilize temporary detours for maintenance of traffic purposes. The western most bridge will have a temporary detour to the north of Highway 212, while the eastern most bridge will have a temporary detour to the south of Highway 212. I have attached a kmz file which shows the current design for this project.

An official species list was generated using the Information for Planning and Conservation (IPaC) system, and the following species were identified as potentially occurring in or near the project area: Geocarpon (Geocarpon minimum), Pink Mucket (Lampsilis abrupta), Winged Mapleleaf (Quadrula fragosa), and Rabbitsfoot (Theliderma cylindrica). I have attached the official species list.

A "no effect" determination was made for the federally listed plant species due to the lack of habitat and known occurrences in the project area(s). A "no effect" determination was also made for the Winged Mapleleaf due to the lack of known occurrences in the project area. The closest known occurrence of the Winged Mapleleaf in found in the far southern portion of Cleveland County in the Saline River. Most commonly, this species is found in portions of the Saline and Ouachita Rivers in southern Arkansas.

The Pink Mucket is frequently found in large rivers with fast-flowing waters and rocky or boulder and sand and gravel substrates. The Rabbitsfoot mussel is known to inhabit small- to medium-sized rivers with moderate to swift currents

with sand and gravel substrates; it has been found in waters up to three meters in depth.

While Bayou Derriseaux is not likely suitable habitat for either of the aforementioned mussels, they are known to occur in the Saline River, approximately 5.0 miles south of the project area. Sedimentation is likely to increase during construction and could potentially affect the water quality downstream. There are known populations of the Pink Mucket and Rabbitsfoot in the Saline River, which Bayou Derriseaux is a tributary to. Due to the possibility that this temporary decline in water quality could affect downstream populations, it is our determination that the proposed project "may affect, but not likely to adversely affect" the Pink Mucket and Rabbitsfoot mussel. We request your concurrence in our determination.

Based on the location of this action, the minimal habitat being affected immediately adjacent to existing roadway and right of way, the distance to known species locations and suitable habitat, and application of standard sediment and erosion controls; the Service agrees with your assessment and concurs with your determinations of "may affect, not likely to adversely affect" for Pink Mucket and Rabbitsfoot. Furthermore, the Service agrees with your assessments and no further consultation for this action regarding the identified species is necessary at this time.


