HIGHLIGHTS OF THE 2013-2014 BIENNIUM

The 10th Annual Southern Regional Equipment Operators "Roadeo" was held in Beckley, West Virginia in 2012. Participants from five state transportation departments, including Arkansas, competed in Tractor/Lowboy, Tandem Axle Dump Truck, Single Axle Dump Truck/Trailer, Tractor/Mower, Backhoe, and Motor Patrol events. The AHTD team finished third place overall.

On April 30, 2013, the Department dedicated a new section of Highway 549. The new stretch extends from Arkansas Boulevard, across Interstate 30 to Highway 71, north of Texarkana. Four separate construction projects totaling \$130 million were awarded to construct the Texarkana Loop. Additional costs brought the total investment to nearly \$150 million.

On May 28, 2013, the new Arkansas Welcome Center at West Memphis was dedicated. The new Welcome Center is a 6400square feet, state-of-the-art facility, with a price tag of nearly \$3 million. The structure was built and is maintained by the Department; Parks and Tourism staffs it.



On August 29, 2013, the multi-million dollar bridge replacement project on Highway 67 east of Hope was dedicated. The \$9.5 million project replaced six bridges and resurfaced a section of the highway between Hope and Emmet.

In September 2013, Deputy Federal Highway Administrator Greg Nadeau came to the Department for the announcement of the Highway 92 project receiving a TIGER V award. Highway 92, in the Fayetteville Shale Play Area, has been one of Arkansas' fastest growing routes, with traffic increasing in the previous two years by up to 15 percent. The Highway 92 project will replace two aging low weight limit bridges and resurface 14 miles of the highway between Center Ridge and Highway 16 just south of Greers Ferry Lake. The corridor experiences heavy truck traffic associated with natural-gas drilling in the area. The new bridges will be built to serve trucks weighing 80,000 pounds. The grant will improve safety and extend the useful life of this key economic corridor.

About 300 people gathered near Star City to officially dedicate the new 18-mile section of Highway 530 on September 6, 2013. The section connects Interstate 530 in Pine Bluff to Highway 114 in Star City. Highway 530 is a planned 38-mile four-lane roadway

often referred to as the Interstate 69 connector road. It will eventually connect Interstate 530 in Pine Bluff to Highway 278 near Wilmar and the proposed Interstate 69 corridor.

The Department won first place at the TransComm 2013 AASHTO annual meeting for the Arkansas Highways Magazine. Attendees from Departments of Transportation in all 50 states including Puerto Rico and the District of Columbia participated in the conference. The annual skills contest which the magazine won an award is conducted by AASHTO to recognize the outstanding work of its public relations practitioners and to promote an exchange of ideas. The contest is considered to be the premier transportation industry competition and the awards have become the standard of public relation excellence among State DOTs.

On October 18, 2013, another section of Highway 167 was dedicated. The \$6.9 million project included widening the highway to five lanes from Highway 69 north approximately three miles to Highway 394. Work also included installation of a new traffic signal at the intersection with Highway 25/69 and added curbs and gutters for a half-mile section.

On April 16, 2014, the announcement was made that the Department had received approval from the Federal Highway Administration and AASHTO to rename the route from Interstate 40 near Alma to the Highway 71B interchange just south of Bella Vista to Interstate 49. The Bella Vista Bypass, which is currently under construction, will have dual designation as Highway 549 and Future Interstate 49 until it is completed to Interstate standards. The Department erected nearly 700 new signs at a total cost of about \$70,000.

In April 2014, it was announced by the Asphalt Pavement Alliance that the Department had won the Perpetual Pavement Award for 2013 for the 2.3 mile section of Highway 425 between Star City and Monticello in southern Lincoln County. It was one of eight highways in the United States to win the award. The award was the forth on in a row received by the Department. Most recently the, in 2012 the Department received the award for a two-mile section on Highway 82 in Lafayette County. To qualify for the award, the pavement must be a minimum of 35 years old and never had a structural failure. It also must have had no rehabilitation over those years that has increased the pavement thickness by more than four inches. Resurfacing intervals must be of no less than 13 years on the average. It must demonstrate the characteristics expected from long-life asphalt pavements: excellence in design, quality in construction, and value to the traveling public.

On May 15, 2014, the Mayor of Lake Village and officials from the Department dedicated Highway 82 opening to four lanes to the Mississippi River. The widening of the Highway 65/82 corridor began about 24 years ago with a \$3.9 million project to build five bridge structures near Lake Village. This final project was \$15 million job to widen almost 4.5 miles and replace one bridge.






Construction Lettings by Funding Source

■ Federal



(Bid Award Includes State Highway System, County Road, and City Street Projects



(Bid Award Includes State Highway System, County Road, and City Street Projects)





EXHIBIT 14Network of Arkansas Public and Paratransit Transportation Providers


