## ARKANSAS STATE HIGHWAY COMMISSION OPENS BIDS FOR IMPROVEMENTS IN CRAIGHEAD COUNTY

**LITTLE ROCK** (5-20) -- The Arkansas State Highway Commission has opened bids for improvements to a roadway in Craighead County, according to Commissioner John Ed Regenold of Armorel.

The purpose of the project is to install a traffic signal at the intersection of Highway 141 and Parker Road in the city of Jonesboro. All Service Electric, Inc. of Hot Springs, Arkansas, was awarded the contract at \$104,670.55.

"This new signal will mean a safer intersection for motorists in this area of Jonesboro," stated Regenold.

Regenold said work could begin on the project in two to four weeks, weather permitting. Completion is expected by December 18, 2009.

The project is being funded with money provided by the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA). The Act provided Arkansas with \$351 million in federal stimulus funds for roadway and bridge improvements throughout the state.
