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ARKANSAS STATE HIGHWAY COMMISSION OPENS BIDS FOR IMPROVEMENTS IN PRAIRIE COUNTY

LITTLE ROCK (4-16) -- The Arkansas State Highway Commission has opened bids for improvements to a roadway in Prairie County, according to Commission Chairman Carl Rosenbaum of North Little Rock.

The purpose of the project is to resurface approximately five and one-half miles of Highway 70. Rogers Group, Inc. of Nashville, Tennessee, was awarded the contract at \$921,699.04.

“These improvements will begin at Highway 63, just east of Hazen, and extend eastward to Highway 33 at DeValls Bluff,” stated Rosenbaum.

Rosenbaum said work could begin on the project in six to eight weeks, weather permitting. Completion is expected by August 3, 2009.

The project is being funded with money provided by the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA). The Act provides Arkansas with \$351 million in federal stimulus funds for roadway and bridge improvements throughout the state.
