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ARKANSAS STATE HIGHWAY COMMISSION OPENS BIDS FOR IMPROVEMENTS IN RANDOLPH COUNTY

LITTLE ROCK (4-16) -- The Arkansas State Highway Commission has opened bids for improvements to a roadway in Randolph County, according to Commissioner John Ed Regenold of Armorel.

The purpose of the project is to resurface approximately one mile of Highway 67. Atlas Asphalt, Inc. of Jonesboro, Arkansas, was awarded the contract at \$247,858.79.

“This project will be located in Pocahontas and will begin at Highway 90 and continue northward,” stated Regenold.

Regenold said work could begin on the project in six to eight weeks, weather permitting. Completion is expected by August 3, 2009.

The project is being funded with money provided by the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA). The Act provides Arkansas with \$351 million in federal stimulus funds for roadway and bridge improvements throughout the state.
