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ARKANSAS STATE HIGHWAY COMMISSION OPENS BIDS FOR IMPROVEMENTS IN CLARK COUNTY

LITTLE ROCK (2-28) -- The Arkansas State Highway Commission has opened bids for improvements to a roadway in Clark County, according to Commission Chairman R. Madison Murphy of El Dorado.

The purpose of the project is to install a new traffic signal at the intersection of Highway 51 and 12th Street in the city of Arkadelphia. All Service Electric, Inc. of Hot Springs, Arkansas, was awarded the contract at \$128,326.01.

“This project will include an upgraded signal as well as intersection improvements such as new wheelchair ramps and crosswalks,” stated Murphy.

The project is being funded with money provided by the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA). The Act provided Arkansas with \$351 million in federal stimulus funds for roadway and bridge improvements throughout the state. Murphy said work could begin on the project in two to four weeks, weather permitting. Completion is expected in August of 2011.

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
