AHTD TO HOLD PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT MEETING IN ROGERS

LITTLE ROCK (7-5) - The Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department (AHTD) will hold a Public Involvement Meeting in Rogers to discuss plans for a section of the proposed eastern North-South corridor between Fayetteville and Rogers, according to AHTD officials.

The meeting will be held on Tuesday, July 17th, from 4:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m., in Room 300 of the Professional Development Center at The Annex, 2922 South 1st Street, in Rogers.

The section of the North-South corridor to be discussed at the meeting begins at Highway 264 in Springdale and extends northward to Highway 94 in Rogers. Several corridor alternatives will be on display.
