ARKANSAS HIGHWAY COMMISSION APPROVES BID FOR IMPROVEMENTS IN BAXTER COUNTY

LITTLE ROCK (7-29) -- The Arkansas State Highway Commission approved a bid for improvements to roadways in Baxter County, according to the Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department (AHTD) officials.

The purpose of the project is to resurface .7 mile of roadways in Gassville. The first portion of the work will be performed on Elm Street. It will extend from Lakeview Drive to Highway 126. A second project will be performed on Lincoln Street. It will extend from Vine Street to Highway 62 (East Main Street).

Twin Lakes Quarry's, Inc. of Mountain Home, AR was awarded the contract at \$68,713.56.

This project is being funded through the State Aid City Streets Program approved by lawmakers in 2011 and voters in 2012. This program provides \$20 million annually from the state motor fuels tax to assist cities with projects selected by a nine-member panel of Arkansas mayors.

Construction is scheduled to begin in two to four weeks, weather permitting. The project should be complete this fall.

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LITTLE ROCK (7-29) -- The Arkansas State Highway Commission approved a bid for improvements to roadways in Baxter County, according to the Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department (AHTD) officials.

The purpose of the project is to resurface 1.8 miles of roadways in Mountain Home. The work will be performed on Arkansas Avenue from Highway 201 to North College Street. The work will continue south on North College Street to Ray Street. Work will also be performed on Coley Drive. It will extend from Highway 201 to Wallace Knob Road.

Twin Lakes Quarries, Inc of Mountain Home, AR was awarded the contract at \$318,136.12.

This project is being funded through the State Aid City Streets Program approved by lawmakers in 2011 and voters in 2012. This program provides \$20 million annually from the state motor fuels tax to assist cities with projects selected by a nine-member panel of Arkansas mayors.
