AHTD TO HOLD PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT MEETING IN FAYETTEVILLE

LITTLE ROCK (1-23) - The Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department (AHTD) will hold a Public Involvement Meeting in Fayetteville to discuss plans for widening a 1.2 mile stretch of Highway 112 (Razorback Road and West Maple Street) to five lanes from Highway 180 (Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd), past Razorback Stadium to Garland Avenue in Fayetteville, according to AHTD officials.

The meeting will be held on Thursday, April 4th, from 4:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m., at the Fayetteville High School Cafeteria. The school is located at 994 West Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd. in Fayetteville.
