AHTD TO HOLD DESIGN PUBLIC HEARING IN MONTICELLO

LITTLE ROCK (4-3) - The Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department (AHTD) will hold a Design Public Hearing in Monticello to discuss the proposed construction of a Monticello Bypass between Highway 278 and Highway 425. Plans include 2 lanes of a future 4 lane divided bypass, southwest of Monticello.

The meeting will be held **Thursday, April 9th**, from 4:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m., at Drew Central High School (Cafeteria). It is located at 250 University Drive in Monticello.
