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IMPROVEMENTS TO I-430 REQUIRE TRAFFIC SHIFT AND OVERNIGHT LANE CLOSURES IN LITTLE ROCK

LITTLE ROCK (9-4) – Overhead sign structure construction requires overnight lane closures on Interstate 430 in Little Rock, according to Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department (AHTD) officials.

The southbound I-430 lanes have been shifted toward the outside shoulder between the Arkansas River Bridge and the State Highway 10 (Cantrell Road) interchange. This traffic pattern will be utilized for several weeks to allow construction of an overhead sign and median barrier wall on I-430.

The work requires closing inside lanes of northbound and southbound I-430 between mile markers 10 and 9. Traffic will be controlled using barrels, electronic message boards and advance warning signs.

The lane closures will occur between midnight **Wednesday, September 9 through Friday morning, September 11**, weather permitting.

- I-430 lane closures will be in effect Wednesday, September 9 between 12:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m.
- Also, I-430 lane closures will be in effect Wednesday, September 9 through Friday, September 11 between 8:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m.,

This project is part of AHTD's Connecting Arkansas Program and includes widening 5.1 miles of I-40 to three lanes in each direction. The work extends east from Highway 365 to Interstate 430. The project is anticipated to be complete in mid 2016. More information on this \$38.4 million project is available at ConnectingArkansasProgram.com.
