PAVEMENT TESTING ON I-30 REQUIRES OVERNIGHT LANE CLOSURES IN LITTLE ROCK AND NORTH LITTLE ROCK

LITTLE ROCK (11-23) – Crews performing pavement testing will require overnight lane closures on Interstate 30 in Little Rock and North Little Rock, according to Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department (AHTD) officials.

Work will require alternately closing the inside and outside lanes of eastbound and westbound I-30 within the work zone between the I-30 South Terminal (mile marker 137) and the I-30 North Terminal (mile marker 143). Traffic will be controlled using traffic cones and advance warning signs.

Overnight lane closures have been ongoing and **will continue through Wednesday morning, November 25 between 8:30 p.m. and 6:00 a.m.**, weather permitting.

This work is part of AHTD's proposed project to widen I-30 in Little Rock and North Little Rock between Interstate 40 and Interstate 530, including the Arkansas River Bridge, as well as improvements to I-40 from JFK Boulevard to Highway 67.
