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IMPROVEMENTS TO INTERSTATE 49 REQUIRE OVERNIGHT CLOSURES ON U.S. HIGHWAY 412 IN WASHINGTON COUNTY

WASHINGTON COUNTY (1-4) – Construction work on I-49 in Springdale will require overnight lane closures on U.S. Highway 412 (West Sunset Avenue), according to Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department (AHTD) officials.

The contractor will be installing a safety platform and removing a section of the bridge decks to accommodate the widening of I-49. Eastbound and westbound lanes on U.S. Highway 412 will alternately be reduced to one lane between the east and west I-49 access ramp intersections. Mainline traffic on I-49 will not be affected.

The lane closures will occur nightly between 11:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m., beginning **Monday night, January 4, 2016 and ending Friday morning, January 29, 2016**, weather permitting. Traffic will be controlled using flaggers and barrels.

This project is part of AHTD's Connecting Arkansas Program and includes widening 4.5 miles of I-49 to three lanes in each direction. The work extends from Highway 71B in Johnson to Highway 412 in Springdale. The project is anticipated to be complete in early 2017.
