Construction on Interstate 49 Requires Overnight Lane Closure in Benton County

BENTON COUNTY (3-10) – Construction work on Interstate 49 in Bentonville and Rogers requires overnight lane closures on I-49, according to Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department (AHTD) officials.

Beginning early **Monday Morning, March 13**, crews will remove temporary concrete barriers, mill existing asphalt, and replace barriers along the inside lanes of northbound and southbound I-49. The inside lanes will be closed between Southeast Walton Boulevard (Exit 85) and Central Avenue/State Highway 72 (Exit 88) to allow for construction. Traffic will be controlled using signage and traffic barrels. This work was expected to be complete March 10 but has been extended **through March 18**.

The lane closures will occur during the following days and times, weather permitting:

- **Monday morning, March 13, between 12:01 a.m. and 6:00 a.m.**
- **Monday night, March 13 to Saturday morning, March 18, between 9:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m.**

This project (Job CA0902) is part of AHTD's Connecting Arkansas Program and includes widening 3.5 miles of I-49 to three lanes in each direction. The work extends from Highway 62/102 to Highway 72 and includes constructing auxiliary lanes from Highway 62/102 toward Southeast Walton Boulevard. Construction is expected to complete in late 2017.
