Arkansas Drivers Reminded that Work Zone Safety is in Their Hands

WASHINGTON COUNTY (4-11) - In observance of National Work Zone Safety Month, the Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department (AHTD) will remind drivers “Work Zone Safety is in YOUR Hands” during a news conference in Fayetteville, according to agency officials.

Along with the American Traffic Safety Services Association, the Associated General Contractors of Arkansas, and the Arkansas Asphalt Pavement Association, the AHTD will host a news conference on Monday, April 17 at 2:00 p.m. in the northeast corner of the Sam’s Club parking lot, at the corner of State Highway 112 and West Trucker Drive in Fayetteville.

Work Zone Safety Month is a national initiative designed to promote public awareness on the dangers of driving distracted and speeding through work zones. Work zones can present an unfamiliar situation to drivers. Changes in traffic patterns, closed or narrowed lanes, and the presence of construction equipment and personnel can cause challenges for motorists as they travel through work zones.
