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Improvements to U.S. Highway 67 Require Lane Shift in Pulaski & Lonoke Counties

PULASKI & LONOKE COUNTIES (8-8) – Construction work on U.S. Highway 67 in Pulaski and Lonoke Counties requires a lane shift onto temporary pavement, according to Arkansas Department of Transportation (ARDOT) officials.

To continue with construction, northbound traffic will be moved onto newly widened pavement between Vandenberg Boulevard in Jacksonville and State Highway 5 in Cabot. Weather permitting; this shift will occur **overnight on Thursday, August 10**. Southbound lanes will then be shifted onto the existing northbound lanes within a few weeks to allow for southbound reconstruction to begin.

Traffic will be controlled using traffic barrels and warning signs. The public is advised to be cautious when traveling in the work zones.

This project (Job CA0605) is part of ARDOT's Connecting Arkansas Program and includes widening 4.6 miles of U.S. Highway 67 from Vandenberg Boulevard in Jacksonville to State Highway 5 in Cabot. The highway is being widened to three lanes in each direction. More information on this \$79.2 million project is available at ConnectingArkansasProgram.com.
