Construction Requires Overnight Lane Closures on Interstate 630 in Little Rock

PULASKI COUNTY (8-23) - Construction to widen Interstate 630 requires overnight lane closures in Little Rock, including traffic stoppages for up to 15 minutes, according to Arkansas Department of Transportation (ARDOT) officials.

Weather permitting, crews will reduce I-630 traffic to one open lane in each direction during overnight hours between Baptist Hospital Drive (Exit 7) and University Avenue (Exit 5). Eastbound and westbound <u>center and outside lanes</u> will be closed during the following hours to conduct the work.

- Sunday night, August 26, from 6:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m.
- Monday night, August 27 to Friday morning, August 31, from 8:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m., nightly

In addition, crews will be erecting structural steel at the Hughes Street overpass, which will require all lanes of traffic to be stopped on I-630 for 15-minute intervals. Weather permitting, this work will occur during overnight hours between 9:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m., from Monday night, August 27 and continuing through Friday morning, August 31.

Traffic will be controlled using signage and barrels. During daytime travel peak hours, all six lanes on I-630 will be open to traffic. Neighborhoods adjacent to the interstate will experience noise impacts during nighttime hours. The public is advised to be cautious when traveling in the work zones.

There will be no lane closures Friday night, August 31 through Tuesday morning, September 4 for the Labor Day holiday weekend.

This project (Job CA0608) is part of ARDOT's Connecting Arkansas Program, which is funded through a 10-year, half-cent sales tax. More information on this \$87.4 million project is available at ConnectingArkansasProgram.com.
