Arkansas Drivers Reminded to use IDriveArkansas.com for Holiday Travel Information

LITTLE ROCK (5-13) - The Arkansas Department of Transportation (ARDOT) reminds drivers to “know before you go” and visit IDriveArkansas.com before traveling during the holiday season.

The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) recommend you stay home as much as possible during the Coronavirus pandemic, but if you choose to travel there are several things to consider before you go.
