Plans for the day include several law enforcement officers riding bulls to raise money for the Make-A-Wish Foundation. In addition, The Old Fort Days Dandies will be performing for the audience. The Dandies are a precision horse riding team made up of high school girls in the Fort Smith area. The group performs precision riding and tricks on horseback.

In addition to the planned events inside the stadium, there will be a dunking booth, food vendors and pony rides.

This is the fourth year for the "Cops on Bulls" event. Proceeds go to the Make-A-Wish Foundation. Make-A-Wish grants the wishes of children diagnosed with life-threatening medical conditions in the United States and its territories.

New Area Maintenance Headquarters IN DISTRICT NINE







HTD EMPLOYEES AT THE BAXTER COUNTY AREA MAINTENANCE HEADQUARTERS WILL SOON BE ENJOYING A NEW FACILITY IN MOUNTAIN HOME. The new Area Headquarters is located just south of town on Highway 5.

The facility was constructed by John M. Brown and Sons, Inc. of Sage, Arkansas, for \$1.5 million. It replaces the old facility in Mountain Home which the Department had outgrown.

"We are very excited about the new facility in Baxter County," stated District Nine Engineer Steve Lawrence. "The contractors and our crews have done an excellent job in constructing it. It is at a much better location and is substantially larger than our old facility, which will allow us to perform our needed functions in a more efficient manner."

The new facility features a new building for the headquarters, a covered wash bay for washing vehicles, a 65' by 100' salt storage building and a commercial salt brine maker with storage tanks for salt brine and other de-icing chemicals.

"The additional salt storage and brine making capacity will be a great benefit during times of snow and ice," Lawrence adds. "It is going to be able to hold approximately 3,000 tons of salt, the largest storage in our District."

A & B Construction, LTD of Harper, Iowa, is constructing the salt storage building. ◆

PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION PROGRAMS NEW DEMO BUILDING

HE NEW DEMONSTRATION BUILDING for the AHTD's Public Transportation Programs Section is now in operation. The building is located at the Central Office complex in Little Rock. It was designed specifically for the purpose of transferring new vehicles to the non-profit agencies receiving them. The building features two bay doors so vehicles can be driven inside for washing and checking equipment. A secured parking lot with oversized parking spaces accommodates all sizes of new vehicles waiting to be picked up by transit provider agencies.

an Engineering Student Intern.


In 2003, he was hired as a Civil

ELLNESS DISCOUNT GUIDELINES FOR THE 2016 PLAN YEAR HAVE BEEN ESTABLISHED.

In order to be eligible for the discount, AHTD employees will need to complete two things.

Members and any spouses included on policies will have to take the online Health Assessment offered by Guidance Resources.

Access the Health Assessment by going to www.ARBenefits.org. Click on "Resources & Links" in the Health Enhancement section of their homepage. On the Resources & Links page, there will be a link for "Guidance Resources" on the right-hand side in the Employee Assistance Program - EAP section. An email confirmation will be received after completing the Health Assessment.

In addition to the assessment, members will also need to have a wellness visit conducted by a physician. Spouses are not required to have a wellness visit to qualify for the discount.

The Health Assessment and wellness visit must be completed by October 31st of this year in order to be eligible for the discount. However, since doctors have up to six months to file a claim, members who want to make sure their wellness visit is processed by the end of the year should have it completed by June 30th.


