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

NEW LOOK, NEW ORDERING PROCEDURE

HE NEW YEAR BEGAN WITH A NEW LOOK FOR DEPARTMENT BUSINESS CARDS AND A NEW PROCESS FOR PLACING CARD ORDERS.

Designed by the Public Information Office, the new layout is one that brings consistency to the look and promotes identity with the AHTD brand. These new cards are meant to replace the official black and white cards that have been used for several years and are the only authorized business cards for the Department. Employees are no longer able to design and print their own business cards.

With the new cards comes a new ordering process — replacing one that took several weeks and several signatures to complete. All card orders will now be placed through a new web site: www.nationsprint.com/ahtd. A shortcut to this location has been placed on the Administrative Forms page found on the Department's intranet. This is the same location that the old business card request form was found.



The new procedure is simple. Employees authorized by their supervisor to order business cards must first create an account profile. Once an account is created, an order can be placed. Supervisors will receive a request for approval email for each employee's order of business cards.

Once approved, the card order will be submitted to an outside vendor for printing. The cards will be printed and shipped directly to the recipient. As with the old system, all costs for printing will be incurred by Public Information/Reprographics.

Employees with business cards are asked to use their remaining stock of official black and white cards before placing a new order. Any employee using an unauthorized card should recycle them and order a new set from the website.




