Federal Highway Administrator Visits Arkansas

Federal Highway Administrator Mary Peters made a trip to Arkansas on June 15th and 16th to meet with the Arkansas State Highway Commission and to get a firsthand look at construction on Highway 67/167 in North Little Rock.

Peters met with members of the Highway Commission to discuss the current status of the Highway Reauthorization Bill and learn about upcoming highway projects in Arkansas.

On the 16th, Peters traveled to a construction job on Highway 67/167 in the McCain Boulevard area of North Little Rock to get a look at some of the new technologies being used in highway construction in Arkansas.

The \$59 million corridor project, between McCain Boulevard and Redmond Road in Jacksonville, will widen the highway to six lanes, relocate entrance and exit ramps and add connectors between the frontage roads.

"Transportation moves the American economy," Peters said. "When complete, this project will improve the quality of life for the families who commute to jobs, schools and stores using this route."

The new technologies being used in the project include high strength, longer-lasting concrete; maintenance-free steel beams; higher visibility road markings; and a new embankment design that reduces the need for extra right of way. Each will contribute to providing a longer lasting roadway with reduced maintenance costs.

"This project is going to give the public a better return on their investment," Peters added.

TO: DIVISION HEADS AND DISTRICT ENGINEERS

SUBJECT: EMPLOYEE SALARY INCREASES

In accordance with Act 686 of the 2003 Legislative Session and Commission Action, regular employees will be given a salary increase based on the following criteria, effective June 24, 2004.

- Employees making \$21,128 a year or less will receive a \$572 increase.
- Employees making \$21,129 to \$50,000 will receive a 2.7% increase.
- Employees making \$50,001 to \$90,000 will receive a 2.7% increase on the first \$50,000 and a 1.9% increase on the remaining amount.
- Employees making \$90,001 or more will receive a 2.7% increase on the first \$50,000, a 1.9% increase on the next \$40,000, and a 1.4% increase on the remaining amount.

Teddy "Mark" Widner has been elected to serve on the board of the Arkansas State Highway Employees Retirement System.



Entry into the competition was established by written exam. The competition focused on promoting uniformity of inspection procedures and challenged officers by utilizing roadside scenarios.



During a banquet hosted by the Arkansas Truck Driving Championship, AHP Chief Ron Burks presented trophies to the top-scoring officers. PFC Mark Pyburn of Marion is the 2004 Grand Champion and earned the right to represent the Arkansas Highway Police at the 2004 North American Inspector’s Championship to be held August 16-22 in Salt Lake City, Utah. Pyburn also received trophies for top scoring in the Level One Inspection and Hazardous Materials Inspection categories. PFC Shad Overman of Newport was awarded the trophy for the top score in the Motor Coach Inspection category.

“The competition allowed our officers to showcase their knowledge, skills and abilities in dealing with very complex motor carrier safety regulations,” stated Chief Burks. “It also provided a great networking opportunity for the officers, drivers and motor carrier safety officials to discuss safety related issues. I was very proud of the professional and conscientious approach our officers took to the competition and believe it is a direct reflection of the work ethic they display on the roadside on a daily basis.”

SMOKING POLICY

Revised May 26, 2004

Effective July 1, 2004

PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to comply with Act 462 of 1987 requiring state agencies to implement a smoking policy for their general office space (space occupied by personnel performing their daily work functions) and to comply with Governor's Policy Directive No. 15 dated May 18, 2004.

POLICY

The smoking of tobacco or products containing tobacco in any form shall be prohibited in all Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department buildings, facilities and vehicles with the following exceptions:

- Smoking shall be permitted by the operator and passengers of Department vehicles assigned for the exclusive, or primarily exclusive, use of the operator if the operator and all passengers are smokers. Smoking shall not be permitted in any pool vehicles or in vehicles in which a non-smoking employee is riding.
- Smoking shall be permitted on Department grounds outside building enclosures, provided the smoker is at least 25 feet from any entrance to any building or enclosure. The Department may restrict outside areas if the smoking activity conflicts with the general use of the specific area.

Appropriate signs will be displayed in non-smoking areas.
