Design Team Places Third Nationally

The University of Arkansas at Little Rock Construction Management Heavy/Civil Design Team finished third in the nation at the annual Associated Schools of Construction and the Associated General Contractors student competition held in San Antonio this spring.

Miyoshi Lasker, a Design Technician in the AHTD's Right of Way Division, was a member of the team. This is the same team that won first place in the Region 5 Associated General Contractors construction competition earlier in the year.

Approximately 242 universities across the country competed in seven regional competitions with only the first place teams advancing to the Nationals. The Heavy/Civil Division consisted of teams from Auburn University, Brigham Young University, Oregon State University, Penn College, University of Cincinnati, University of Nebraska and the University of Arkansas at Little Rock (UALR).

The competition is designed to help students understand highway procedures and construction from a real-world scenario of what it takes to estimate, bid and build a heavy civil job.

The project consisted of elevating an 1,100-foot section of roadway over the Whitewater River Channel. The major challenge was removing and replacing the bridge while still providing an open 28-foot minimum roadway width. There was also extensive channel work to be performed and construction had to be scheduled around the rainy season and year-round flash flooding.

In addition to Lasker, the UALR team consisted of Waylon Corley, Angel Corley, Lisa Bishop, Jeremy Land and Kevin Young. The team was coached by Michael Tramel.

Roadcheck 2007


The Arkansas Highway Police participated in Roadcheck 2007 this month. The event is coordinated by the Commercial Vehicle Safety Alliance and was held June 6th – 8th across North America. The roadside inspections are performed in order to prevent truck and bus crashes and to save lives. In Arkansas, 376 vehicles were inspected. Nationally, a total of 10,000 specially-trained and certified officers were involved in the program this year.

Salary Increases Take Effect

In accordance with Act 804 of the 2007 Legislative Session and Commission Action, AHTD employees received a two percent salary increase effective June 21, 2007. The salary increase will be seen on the July 12, 2007, paycheck.

In addition, Act 289 of the 2007 Legislative Session made provisions for the Department to consider an additional salary increase in mid-October based on employee performance. The Department is currently developing guidelines for implementing the provisions of Act 289.
