The AHTD announced the following promotions on October 20th.

David Henning has been named District 2 Maintenance Engineer. Henning began working for the Department in June of 1988 as an Advanced Estimates Technician in Contract Estimates. He advanced to Civil Engineer Technician a year later. In 1990, Henning advanced to Civil Engineer I and then transferred to the Pine Bluff Resident Engineer Office in November of that year. He was promoted to Construction Field Engineer I in December of 1991, and a year later advanced to Construction Field Engineer II. CONSTRUCTION



Construction is underway on a new Arkansas Welcome Center at Blytheville. Work began on the Center in July of 2007. The contract was awarded to Olympus Construction of Jonesboro for \$3,484,991.

Phase One of the project included providing a temporary Welcome Center trailer, where Parks and Tourism employees could continue to assist visitors to the Natural State. In addition, Phase One consisted of demolishing a portion of the old Center while keeping the bathroom facilities accessible to the public.

Approximately 60% of the work is completed. Presently, the heating and cooling, sheetrock, bathroom tile, sidewalks and pavilion trim are being installed. Upcoming construction activities will include colored concrete walks, exterior lighting, skylights, flooring, staining and sealing the wood elements.

Douglas Fir and Pine are being used for the building. In addition to being North America's most plentiful softwood species, Douglas Fir is also one of the strongest and hardest of the softwoods. The rock used on the Welcome Center is native Arkansas fieldstone. The 6,500 square foot structure will be heated and cooled by a geothermal system, utilizing over 5,000 feet of underground piping.

Construction and landscaping should be completed by the spring of 2009.

In 2007, over 53,000 travelers visited the old Blytheville Welcome Center.



As the nation's largest charity, United Way of America understands the


impact that charitable giving has on improving communities and helping individuals.



Inclement Weather

The months ahead could bring us a round or two of frozen precipitation.

In the event that AHTD employees are excused by official action due to inclement weather, the following policy will be in effect:

Official media notice to state agencies will apply to AHTD employees except designated essential personnel. The Inclement Weather Policy excuses employees from work until 10:00 a.m. unless otherwise specified by official media notice. When inclement weather is isolated to a particular area of the state, the District Engineer is authorized to determine if the Inclement Weather Policy applies to that area.

Employees who report to work after the excused time will be charged leave calculated between the excused time and their arrival time. Employees who do not report to work at all will be charged for a full day's leave.

Sick leave or annual leave may be utilized for inclement weather. Leave without pay will be utilized for employees who are temporary, part-time or in an exhausted leave status.

AHTD employees working under the flex schedule must adjust their time accordingly.

Cafeteria Plan Enrollment

Enrollment in the Department's Section 125 Cafeteria Plan for the Plan Year 2009 is underway this month. Forms for enrollment in the program have been distributed to all AHTD employees.

To be eligible for enrollment, you must be employed by the Department for six months. Those employees declining participation for Plan Year 2009 will not be eligible to enroll until the next Plan Year beginning January 1, 2010, unless they incur a qualified change in family status. In addition, employees that enroll cannot make changes to their plan selection during the year unless they incur a qualified change in family status.

Remember, you must sign the form even if you are declining participation in the program. Forms should be returned to your District or Division Office on or before November 26, 2008.
