

CONSTRUCTION CORNER

Crews completed a project in April near Bonanza, just south of Fort Smith, to realign a section of Highway 45 at Backbone Mountain. The old highway looped around the east side of the mountain. This project, utilizing Federal Safety Funds, provided for the realignment of a 1.2-mile section of the highway. The improvements straightened the road by using a 160-foot high cut through the mountain north of Sebastian Lake. This provides a much safer, more direct route for motorists.

In addition to straightening the roadway, the project also realigned and made grade modifications at the intersection of Highway 45 and Bethel Road, south of the lake, to provide for a safer intersection.

The job was awarded to Hill Brothers Construction and Engineering Company of Faulkner, Mississippi, in January of 2006 for \$7,085,137. Work began in March of that year. The Resident Engineer on the project was Dean Nichols.




