

Arkansas Voters Approve Highway Bond Program

In an election on November 8th, Arkansas voters gave their overwhelming support to the Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department to begin a new Interstate Rehabilitation Program similar to the one passed in 1999.

Governor Mike Beebe announced last summer the issuance of a proclamation calling for the special election on highway bonds for the new program. The measure was approved by 81% of the voters and authorizes the Arkansas Highway Commission to issue up to \$575 million in GARVEE Bonds for improvements to existing Interstate miles in the state.

“Arkansans will soon see the dividends from this investment in Arkansas,” Beebe stated on election night. “Better Interstates and the jobs created to modernize them will help both our economy and our prospects for the future.”

The key elements of the program will be to use GARVEE bonds financed by future federal funds and the existing 4-cent

diesel tax as well as additional federal and state matching funds to create a nearly \$1 billion construction program, without any new taxes or raising any existing taxes.

“I think this vote is evidence that the people are pleased with the way our Interstates have been improved in recent years,” stated AHTD Director Scott Bennett. “Now we can continue using this funding mechanism on future Interstate improvements.” The Department expects to make improvements on more than 400 miles of Interstate under the program.

“With this program in place, it will speed Interstate repairs that would have taken far longer and proved more costly if spread over a greater number of years when you take inflation into account” stated Commission Chair Madison Murphy.


“This is a chance to make our Interstates smoother and safer for motorists traveling the state of Arkansas,” Murphy added.

Thornton Head of Programs and Contracts

Kevin Thornton was named Division Head for the Programs and Contracts Division on October 20th.

Thornton has a Bachelor's Degree in Civil Engineering from the University of Arkansas. He is a Registered Professional Engineer.

He advanced to Design Engineer a year later. In 1987, he transferred to the Hot Springs Resident Engineer Office and advanced to Construction Field Engineer I. Thornton transferred to the Camden Resident Engineer Office in 1990 as an Advanced Construction Field Engineer and then was promoted to Assistant Resident Engineer in 1991. He transferred to the Hot Springs Resident Engineer Office in 1992 as the Assistant Resident Engineer. Thornton became a Staff Construction Engineer for the Construction Division in 2006. He moved into the Systems Administrator position in 2007. Thornton was promoted to Assistant Division Head of Programs and Contracts in June of this year.




This month's "What's Cooking" recipe is from...

Billy Ficker • District 1

WHITE CHILI

Ingredients

- ¼ tsp. salt
- 1 tsp. chili powder
- ¼ tsp. black pepper
- 2 tsp. ground cumin
- 1 Tbsp. vegetable oil
- 1 garlic clove, minced
- 3 ½ cups chicken broth
- 1 medium onion, chopped
- 1-14.5 oz. can diced tomatoes, undrained
- 5-16 oz. cans great northern beans, undrained
- 6 skinless, boneless chicken breast halves (1.5 to 2 lbs. total), cut into 1" cubes



In a soup pot, heat oil over medium heat. Sprinkle chicken with salt and pepper, and saute 5 to 6 minutes, until browned.

Add onion and garlic and cook 3 to 4 minutes, or until onion is tender. Add remaining ingredients and bring to a boil.

Reduce heat to low and simmer 50 to 60 minutes, or until chili thickens slightly, stirring occasionally.

If you like it hot add, a 4 oz. can of green chilies.

Cafeteria Plan Enrollment Ends Soon

■ Enrollment in the Department's Section 125 Cafeteria Plan for Plan Year 2012 is currently underway. Forms for the program have been sent to all AHTD employees.

■ To be eligible for enrollment, you must have been employed by the Department for six months. Those employees declining participation for Plan Year 2012 will not be eligible to enroll until the next plan year in January of 2013 unless they incur a qualified change in family status. Likewise, once enrolled, employees cannot make changes to their plan selection unless they incur a qualified change in family status. These qualified changes include marriage, divorce, death of a spouse or child, birth or adoption of a child or termination/commencement of a spouse's employment.

■ Please remember to sign the form even if you are declining participation in the program. The forms should be returned to your District or Division Office **on or before November 30, 2011.**
