AHTD and AAPA Share Common Goals and Objectives

The Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department and the Arkansas Asphalt Pavers Association (AAPA) have begun the year 2012 by affirming their shared goal of providing the best roadways for Arkansas motorists and those traveling through our state.

At the annual AAPA conference held in Little Rock on January 5th, representatives of the two groups signed an agreement of goals and objectives as a means of enhancing communications between the two organizations, nurturing the working relationships the two share, and providing quality asphalt pavements in the months ahead.

Among the goals the organizations will focus on moving forward are:

- Promoting quality asphalt pavements through improvement in design, construction and pavement preservation practices;
- Continued use of joint committees or task forces to provide the best products and facilities possible; and
- An effort to continue to research and encourage the appropriate use of recycled materials and other sustainable practices by using sound science to analyze potential long term performance, environmental and economic benefits.

Department Announces Red Zones Campaign

The Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department (AHTD) has announced the “Know the RED•Zones” campaign to highlight areas with significantly reduced capacity during highway construction projects in the state.

“Our goal with this campaign is simple. We want travelers to be aware of these RED•Zones and to consider alternate routes, when available, before they get into a construction area,” said AHTD Director Scott Bennett.

“If motorists choose to drive through the project, then we want them to have the latest information available for the safest possible travel.”

The initial RED•Zones project is the Interstate 40 project located in Prairie County (between Little Rock and Memphis). The \$56 million job includes the rehabilitation of existing Interstate 40 lanes in a 10-mile section located on the east and west sides of the White River Bridge.

During peak driving times, over 40,000 vehicles travel the area each day, according to Department officials. Now that lane closures are in place, delays through the construction zone are expected. Because of the type of work being performed, the contractor will have to reduce the four lanes down to two lanes by placing both east and west-bound vehicles on one side of the Interstate. Once one side is completed the same scenario will move to the other side. Estimated completion for construction is late 2013.

“The Interstate 40 work zone has multiple safety precautions built into the contract,” noted Bennett. “There

will be a Traffic Control Supervisor and a Motorist Assistance Program (MAP) vehicle on site at all times.”

The Traffic Control Supervisor will be responsible for all aspects of traffic control and will have the ability to provide real time information of any incidents by way of message boards and highway advisory radio channels. The work zone also features portable lighting in crossover traffic areas and additional signage to remind travelers to drive safely.

“The idea behind the education campaign is that if we can reach a traveler, for example, in Conway on their way to Memphis and we inform them about the Interstate 40 work zone, then they might choose to take Highway 64 through Beebe and Bald Knob to West Memphis,” explained Bennett.

“The bottom line is that it is just going to take longer to drive Interstate 40 between Little Rock and Memphis, and people need to be aware of that and plan accordingly,” said Bennett. “If we combine enough people opting for alternate routes with the traffic management plans in place, then we can have a safer work zone, an easier to drive through work zone, and maybe a work zone that even gets completed ahead of time.”

CONSTRUCTION CORNER DISTRICT 2



Work is progressing near Lake Village on a project that will widen 4.5 miles of Highway 82 to five lanes. The project was awarded to Ideal Construction Company of Crossett, Arkansas, in February of 2011 for \$15.2 million. Work began in May of last year. The widening begins in Fairview, at the intersection with Highway 65, and continues eastward to the Mississippi River Bridge.

This project connects to a widening project that was recently completed on Highway 82. Once this project is completed, motorists will have four travel lanes to the Highway 82 Bridge. Replacement of a bridge over Ditch Bayou is also part of the project. The job is almost 50% complete and is expected to be wrapped up in the fall of this year. Tim Kelly is the Resident Engineer on the project.
