

# **NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING ON INTERCHANGE LOCATION**

## **Job 061190 I-40 Interchange (Maumelle) Pulaski County**

The City of Maumelle, in association with the Arkansas State Highway & Transportation Department, the City of North Little Rock and Pulaski County, will conduct an open forum Location Public Hearing on Tuesday, December 6, 2011 from 4 PM to 7 PM, at the Jess Odom Community Center, 1100 Edgewood Drive in Maumelle.

The proposed project is located in the cities of Maumelle, and North Little Rock Arkansas in Pulaski County Arkansas. The project consists of the proposed addition of an interchange to Interstate 40 and a connecting road to Highway 100 (Maumelle Boulevard).

The open forum format allows concerned citizens the opportunity to attend the hearing anytime between the hours of 4 PM and 7 PM. Representatives of the City of Maumelle will be present to answer questions concerning the proposed project. Information on proposed right-of-way appraisal and acquisition procedures, as well as the environmental documentation, will be available at the hearing.

A copy of the Environmental Assessment is available for public inspection at Maumelle City Hall, 550 Edgewood Drive, Suite 590, at the city library, 10 Lake Pointe Drive, and at the Maumelle Community Center, 1100 Edgewood Drive, all in the City of Maumelle.

Persons wishing to submit written statements or other exhibits in place of, or in addition to, oral or written statements made at the public hearing may submit them to the City of Maumelle, ATTN: Mayor Watson, at the address above. Such submissions must be received no later than 4:30 PM Friday, December 30, 2011.
